NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. Today we are blessed to have **Fr. Matthew** speaking to us at all masses on behalf of the Diocese of Wa. **Today is Mission Appeal Sunday.**

Located in north-west Ghana, this diocese was established in 1959. Wa is a little smaller than New Jersey having a Catholic population of approximately 431,000 (43% of the area's population). Please note that as of 2021 only 10% of Ghana's people identify themselves as Catholic.

Ghana is about the size of Oregon with a population close to that of California. Ghana is the second-most populous country in West Africa with nearly 35 million inhabitants. Ghana is geographically closer to the intersection of the Prime Meridian and the Equator than any other country, since this point, (0°, 0°), is located off the south-east coast of Ghana in the Atlantic Ocean.

Most Ghanaians are Christians (71.3%); almost a fifth are Muslims; a tenth practice traditional faiths or report no religion. French is widely taught in schools and used for commercial and international economic exchange.

Ghana and the diocese of Wa do have a wet and dry season. Wa is mostly Savanna plains (grass lands). In Ghana 38% of rural dwellers live in poverty. Wa is considered a hot, dry rural region.

Archbishop Gomez has asked that assistance be given to our immigrant sisters and brothers who have been affected by recent deportation activities in the archdiocese. To this end, a "Family Assistance Program" has been created and will be administered by each parish to provide assistance and support to these individuals and families.

Please indicate "Family Assistance" on the memo line of the check. These donations will be allocated for immediate use in the Cardinal McIntyre Fund account.

Please note that although this official announcement implies that aid is only available for those fearing deportation, (through St. Jerome) the Cardinal McIntyre Fund and our own St. Vincent de Paul Society do provide assistance. The McIntyre Fund is only for registered parishioners.

Precepts of the Catholic Church

The Precepts of the Catholic Church describe the MINIMUM actions and behaviors required to be considered a practicing Catholic. The Church uses these "precepts" (standard operating procedures) to remind us that Christian life requires a commitment to prayer as well as active participation in the liturgy and sacraments.

Each of these precepts of the Catholic Church is important. Together with the Ten Commandments, they represent a starting point for moral living. An INTEN-TIONAL, FREELY CHOSEN violation of a precept is serious (grave matter) and most likely will be a mortal sin. (For something to be a mortal sin: it is serious stuff, we know we should not do, and we willingly and freely choose to do it anyway.)

THE FIVE PRECEPTS

- 1. You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation. The body of Christ gathering together, as well as the opportunity to be fed with God's Word and the Bread of Life are essential.
- 2. You shall confess your sins at least once a year. Confession is a gift and resource to help us remain in grace and receive God's mercy.
- 3. You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least once during the Easter season.
- 4. You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.
- 5. You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church (each according to his own ability). This includes supporting the church's missionary activity.
