Fr. Bill's Musings

The older I get, the faster time seems to go. Teacher meetings for the upcoming school year are near. So much is happening: uniform sales, carnival preparation, carnival pre-sale tickets, packing for the pilgrimage, getting bulletins done in advance of the pilgrimage, wedding preps, worrying about pet care for Sparta (my dog) and Fuzzy Bob (my cat), working with children on guitar and ukulele, and of course, ministering the sacraments to the people of God and praying with and for the church and the world. Although I do not know what the future holds I am grateful it is in God's hands. Jesus, I trust in you. As Saint Teresa of Avila said "Nada te turbe, nada te espante, todo se pasa, Dios no se muda," which means "Let nothing disturb you, let nothing frighten you, everything passes, God does not change." He has this. Jesus, I trust in you.

Here is some parish music history you may have lived recounted by Laura Lockwood (on bulletin cover). Our focus is on Rita Courville (on bulletin cover) who we just learned has died. Rita started the Folk Group in the late 1960s, upon the request of the Sisters that taught at St. Jerome School. Rita was in the sixth grade at the time. While originally providing music at the school masses, Fr. Barnes, the newly ordained associate pastor in 1969 asked the group to sing at the 11am Sunday Mass. Rita continued to lead the group of high school/ college age singers/musicians until 1983 under Monsignor Meckler who was pastor from 1973-1987. In the final years, the group consisted of: Rita on guitar, Ed Pausic on bass (RIP 2018), Ralph Amendola on mandolin and Laura Lockwood on flute. Rita is survived by her four children and her grandchildren. The 8am Mass hymns today were chosen to honor Rita Courville who passed away from cancer two years ago.
