

Fr. Bill's Musings

I find it interesting that those places where the overturning of the Roe vs. Wade Decision will mean few if any changes seem to have the greatest concern and anger (California and New York). While the communities where this will mean some changes (such as elimination of late term abortion, or no abortions after child's heartbeat can be confirmed) seem comfortable with control being returned to their own state's representatives and voters.

My hope is that through prayer and persistence we may eventually be able to ban late term abortions in California but **PROPOSITION 1 SEEKS TO GUARANTEE THE RIGHT TO LATE TERM ABORTIONS**. Late term abortion is when the viable baby is partially removed from its mother's womb. (It is important that some of the baby remain inside the mother for legal reasons.) The baby's skull is pierced and its brain is vacuumed out. Only then is the "fetus" completely removed from its mother. I am disgusted by politicians, some of whom claim to be Catholic, who defend and want all women to have access to this "procedure." Having felt the kicks of nephews and nieces within the womb and seen the ultrasound images which show so clearly they are alive and human.

But, as I said for us here in California, other than our state's government offering transportation and accommodation for women of other states who wish to have the fetal tissue mass removed from their uterus... (Do they offer photo packages for this California Experience?) nothing has changed other than perhaps a few clinics which offer and encourage other options beside abortion being threatened, defaced or destroyed.

We are sometimes called haters, as well as evil for speaking the truth. Their hate for the truth and the light it brings to their words and actions angers them. Human life is precious and should be defended from the womb until natural death and the tomb, even the lives of those who hate us and might consider us enemies.

I know that those who do not believe in God mock us when Catholics speak about the need for and the power of prayer. But God knows we need to be praying now, more than ever.




