**Labor Day Schedule**


In recognition of Labor Day, Monday, September 5th, Daily Mass will be at 8am as usual followed by Adoration.

## Fr. Bill's Musings

Young adults today need hope. Many having rejected church and religion now live lives of despair: they find themselves in a life without meaning. They are looking for purpose. They have the highest levels of depression and thoughts of suicide on record (1 out of 4). Since 2010 they are 4 times more likely to die from "unintentional injuries" like overdoses than previous groups of young adults. They are 40% more likely to have liver damage from alcohol consumption and are 4 times more likely to die from alcohol poisoning. These "unintentional injuries" are the number 1 cause of death for young adults. They are 39% more likely to die from suicide. (The number 3 cause of death for young adults.) They may say they are fine... but their loneliness, escape into drugs and technology... leaves their hearts empty. Young St. Augustine also at first tried things of this world to fill his heart, as well.

You may have heard of "Quiet Quitting." Young people today believe that **their job is what should provide their purpose and meaning in life.** Your employer has a purpose for your work, but giving your life meaning? If a job fails to fulfill their hopes, rather than quitting, they "quiet quit." They still come to work to get a paycheck. But they consciously and intentionally do as little as they can get away with. (And brag about it!) Their employer might be the last to know they have already left the job.

My first job was shoveling sand into a pipe. It was an underground chemical tank that they needed to fill with sand in order to build a parking lot over it. The blisters on my hands and my sweat soaked clothing testify that I wasn't phoning it in. This was not about finding meaning in life. This was about getting spending money for things I wanted. I worked to live, not lived to work.

I truly believe that God made each of us in His image, on purpose for His purpose. If I am honest with myself, I will be able to recognize the dream that God has for me. This dream through which I can best love and accept love, through which I can best forgive and accept forgiveness, through which I can best make His Kingdom not just present in my heart, but revealed to others is called our vocation. Living our vocation, which flows from our baptism, is the path for our happiness, holiness and heaven. It won't always be easy, but things which are truly worthwhile rarely are. When we choose to love others, we embrace dying to

ourselves that we may give hope and life... and that we may be fully alive.

God has plans for us: priesthood, religious life, married life, widows and generous singles. We are serving our Lord. We are making His kingdom more visible. Our vocation (God's call) and our advocacy (my job which provides food, shelter and clothing) are not necessarily identical. We don't live (vocation) to work (advocation), we work so that we may live. Young people will find meaning when they find God and embrace His loving plan for them.

I pray that the peace and joy we reveal in living our vocations may open the eyes of young adults to the source of our hope and joy: Our Lord, Jesus Christ.
