Fr. Bill's Musings

I occasionally get questions about why Catholics worship Mary. Given statues, paintings, scapulars and medals I can understand the misunderstanding. Yet, I (and they also) have pictures and mementos held precious of grandparents, family and friends who we love and have helped nurture and shape our lives. Our Blessed Mother is one of those people for most Catholics.

Often, the Rosary comes up as "Praying to Mary, rather than God." When I pray the Rosary, I meditate on God intervening in His creation to reveal to us the way He wants us to live, the truth of what truly matters, and the life we are called to share with Him and each other. That Mary was chosen to be a part of His plan, just is... and can be for us when we echo Mary's words and choices, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word."

The prayers of the Rosary such as the Creed, the Our Father and the Glory Be are universally recognized by almost all denominations of Christians. The various "Mysteries" we remember and meditate upon break open God coming into our history and bringing salvation for those who believe in His only begotten Son.

Some people have a problem with the Hail Mary and the last two Glorious Mysteries (Today's feast of the Assumption of Mary and her being crowned as Queen of Heaven.)

The Hail Mary is based on the scriptures found in chapter one of the gospel according to Luke. The angel Gabriel says to Mary at the Annunciation, "Hail, favored one! The Lord is with you." "Blessed are you among women" are the words of

the Angel Gabriel as Mary is asked to be the mother of our savior. The second half of the Hail Mary is requesting Mary to intercede, to pray for us. Don't most of us request other's prayers at times of need? As Mary is Jesus' mother, she seems, as she acted at the Wedding Feast at Cana, an obvious choice to join with our petitions to God.

The fourth Glorious Mystery, Mary being assumed into heaven, has Biblical precedents. Elijah went up into heaven in a fiery chariot. Enoch went to walk with God. In the book of Maccabees three friends of Daniel (Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego) are seen unfettered and walking with one like the "Son of Man" amid the flames of a fiery furnace before they depart. And from the gospel according to Matthew 27: 51-53 "And behold, the veil of the sanctuary was torn in two from top to bottom. The earth quaked, rocks were split, tombs were opened, and the bodies of many saints who had fallen asleep were raised. And coming forth from their tombs after his resurrection, they entered the holy city and appeared to many." As these saints didn't hang around, their being taken up into heaven is also a possibility. Ultimately we believe that what has happened with Mary, will happen with us in our glorified body.

The fifth Glorious Mystery, Mary being crowned as queen of heaven, as the mother of Jesus, who is King of Kings and Lord of Lords, then she is without doubt the Queen-Mother. All who are faithful in following Jesus and have suffered for this witness will reign with Him is found in St. Paul and the book of Revelation. To reflect upon her faithfulness and sharing in her son's sorrows can give all of us hope in the midst of trouble and tribulation that Jesus will bring those who are faithful through to the glory of His Kingdom.
