Rosary - following 8am daily Mass

From Fr. Bill

"Could you please repeat the name?" (Calls like this happen with unexpected deaths.)

I must be mishearing or misunderstanding. She is young. She is in good health. She is married and a mother. Her family are not strangers to St. Jerome... although like many with the archbishop's dispensation from attending Sunday Mass during this pandemic, they have been praying from their homes and zooming this year.

I arrive at their home. Family and friends are gathered being helpful and supportive. Muted voices... heads shaking... people praying this is a nightmare from which they will awaken to find this isn't happening.

We pray. We read scripture. There are tears and torn hearts. Some ask, "Why her?" "Why?" Some questions in this world we will not know the answer to. As Jesus reminds us in Luke about why bad things happen to particular people, "Do you assume that those eighteen on whom the tower in Siloam fell and killed were worse sinners than all the others who live in Jerusalem?" This world is broken.

Catholics know that although we may not know why, these situations are opportunities for God's glory to be shown through our acts of compassion and mercy.

Her friends and family are present with one another. They are witnessing to their love of God and of one another. They are comforting the mourning and some time soon they will assist in the corporal work of mercy of helping bury the dead.

How she died isn't as important as her departure from this world, now physically absent from her children and her husband. She is no longer with them or us in the same way.

I actually do not ask people how someone died. I ask them HOW THEY FOUND OUT their loved one has died. If they want to tell me the cause of death... they will. And if for some reason it might be too painful for them to share or they might not yet know, I have not put them in an awkward situation. (I have known apparently healthy people who have died, and who even after an autopsy have their cause of death remain undetermined or unknown.)

I know Jesus loves her. I know He thinks His giving His life for her to be able to become an adopted child of God. I believe that she loves Jesus and, although she (like all of us) sometimes fell short of the goal... in her heart she wanted to please her Lord and Savior.

Her race in this world is done. Now through God's forgiveness and mercy is the time for her to go up to our Father's House. Through our prayers we assist her. With the bonds of love which connect us to her and to the Lord... we uplift her. With these same connections of love in the Lord, she prays for us as well.

At the Transfiguration Jesus was in conversation with Moses and Elijah. (Evidently alert and alive) Jesus reminds the Sadducees (who deny eternal life) that YHWH is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. "He is not the God of the dead, but of the living. You are badly mistaken!" Those who belong to the Lord, and remain with His Body in this world are fully united with our Head in the next.

An Irish pastor I knew in Columbus, Ohio use to say, "Being Catholic is a hard bed to lie on, but a beautiful bed to die on."

She has completed the race and kept the faith. The greater challenge is for those of us still in this world with it's challenges, temptations and distractions.

Don't lose sight of what truly matters: our salvation. Strive to keep this main thing, the main thing... and cling to Jesus for being with Him, living in His Spirit and helping others come to know the way to Our Father is what truly matters.

Be prepared. Stay in grace. Be generous with words of gratitude, appreciation, forgiveness and love for no one knows the day, nor the hour we will be called before our Lord and master. But always be ready for it shall be someday.

Speaking of someday, I will shout it from the housetops when the diocese permits us to use the Senior Center and our other facilities for indoor gatherings. I ask for your continued patience. (It better not be 40 years!) Being safe rather than sorry seems to be the guiding principle. It might be as soon as June 15th but don't count your chickens before they hatch! Remember that this was originally ONLY going to be for two weeks. Please laugh and hang in there! With my prayers and best wishes, Fr. B.
