NICENE CREED

Fr. Bill's Musings

Although I hate to fly, a pilgrimage to the Holy Land is one of the things on my bucket list. I will be going to the Holy Land on October 19th and returning on the 28th. Please pray for those of us going on this pilgrimage as we will pray for you. Also, I know you will treat kindly the priests who step up to share their gift of Holy Orders during my absence.

The current second largest denomination in the United States is no longer ex-Catholics but the none of the above, now called the unaffiliated. This group are not people drifting from a church. These are people consciously rejecting church and religion. The unaffiliated generally did not have family or friends who talked about their faith or religion. Although they had gone to religious services, they were unable to say who or what God is and why God or attending church services matter. Church is something you do, not who you are.

In our culture of self-invention: my life is all about me... what I want, what I feel... MY FREEDOM COMES BEFORE EVERYTHING ELSE. Anything which opposes my freedom is power or privilege seeking to oppress and control people: EVIL. This conflicts with church's teachings about moral behavior. There is tension here as Jesus challenges us to make a choice and become His disciples. In saying yes to Jesus, we need to learn to say no to things which are destructive to ourselves and the Body of Christ. God's plan for me doesn't exist in a "my will be done" culture.

What can we do when almost 25% of young adults WANT TO BE UNCHURCHED? Walk the talk and pray!

First, family's matter. That we go to church is good, but do our children have an experience of their home being the domestic church? Is home a place where we pray together? Do we speak and live the importance of prayer, sacrament and serving others?

Second, we need as parishes to emphasize our nature as community, home and family. All are welcomed. Do our faces and actions show this? Hospitality and helping people know that they belong are important.

Third, we need to emphasize the beautiful as a path to encounter God. Beauty attracts. Well proclaimed scriptures, well-done music with full and active participation does leave an impression. Devotions when done with faith and fervor give powerful testimony.

Fourth, we need to emphasize the importance of the mass and receiving the Eucharist. "This is My Body." Mass can offer great reassurance and comfort which can be most appreciated during difficult times.

WHEN WE LEAVE THE CHURCH, WE ARE IN MISSION TERRITORY. Know that in our words and behavior inside church and as we go out into the world matter. We are Christ's witnesses to this generation.

Safeguard the Children: DID YOU KNOW?



Talking about stranger danger The idea of "stranger danger" is often too broad a concept for children to grasp as not all strangers are dangerous, and children will always be meeting new people and on occasion may need to ask a stranger for help. Instead of issuing a blanket warning, try these tips for keeping children safe around people they do not know. If an unknown adult approaches them, have them check with a parent or known and trusted adult before engaging in conversation. This can be as simple as a quick look to the parent followed by a nod indicating that it is okay to interact. As an adult yourself, you can set a good example by talking first to parents, then to children in their care. This helps your own children see how trustworthy adults engage with children around their parents and helps them learn caution for adults who do not act in the same way.
