**CURRENT ST. JEROME CHURCH PROTOCOLS**

1. You are encouraged to hand sanitize when you arrive and when you depart.
2. **Please sit in the benches pointed to by the green arrows.** This assists with our current offertory system and allows for social distancing for those who need it.
3. Masks are not required for fully vaccinated individuals outdoors or indoors for religious services. **Currently LA County and the diocese is asking that both the vaccinated and non-vaccinated wear masks indoors.** (If needed, masks are available near entrances.)
4. As singing is a form of prayer and a sign our union in the Lord, singing at services is encouraged.
5. The Communion Procession will begin from the front row to assist in keeping reasonable spacing. If you can touch the person ahead of you, most likely you are too close. Try to be reverent, conscious and intentional about preparing yourself to receive the Eucharist. Thank you.
6. Communion will only be under the form of bread. Communion on the hand is strongly encouraged but communion on the tongue is now permitted.

## Fr. Bill's Musings

The current second largest denomination in the United States is the none of the above, or more accurately, the unaffiliated. This group are not people drifting from a church. These are people consciously rejecting church and religion. They generally do not have family or friends who discussed or talked about their faith or religion. Although they had gone to religious services, they were unable to say who or what God is and were unable to express why it was important to go to services. Church is something you do, not who you are. Their experience of church tends to be, "Religion is weird."

The combination of relativism (truth is a matter of opinion) as well as the promotion and availability of extremely wide and diverse perspectives has resulted in a generation which is open minded to almost everything that on the surface doesn't seem to hurt people, except the "opinion" that some behaviors and choices are somehow wrong. People and groups who hold this judgmental view are considered oppressive and evil in prohibiting people from becoming who they want to be.

In our culture of self-invention: my life is all about me... what I want, what I feel... or the group I have chosen to be identified as. Anything which opposes my freedom is power or privilege seeking to oppress and control me and others. This "live and let live" philosophy of open mindedness and license to choices, behaviors and actions conflicts with the church's teachings about moral behavior. There is tension here as Jesus challenges us to make a choice and become His disciples. In saying yes to Jesus, we need to learn to say no to things which are destructive to ourselves and the Body of Christ. This "my life is to help bring fullness of life to others" with God's plan and purpose conflicts with their view of the meaning of life.

What can we do? First, as most of the unaffiliated reach this judgement of the church being irrational and evil as teens, our children need to be made aware and somehow involved in church-based actions of kindness, mercy and justice. Their experience of the love nurturing, life giving church can make accusations of religion, church and God as causes of evil ring false.

Second, family's matter. That we go to church is good, but do our children have an experience of their home being the domestic church? Is home a place where we pray together? Do we share our experiences of how God is working in our life or where we encountered God today? Is the family Bible a paperweight or something we break open and share? Do we invite guests to pray with our family? Is going to Sunday Mass a priority?

Third, we need as parishes to emphasize our nature as community, home and family. All are welcomed, yet we need to help one another make connections and help them feel and know that they belong. It is important to build connection with others and if someone we care for is absent... to reach out and see how they are doing. The size of the Catholic Church and the number parish hoppers make this challenging. Yet I know people who have returned to the church just because someone else noticed they were missing. Many of the unaffiliated believed their presence or absence at services does not seem to make a difference to others.

Fourth, we need to emphasize the beautiful as a path to encounter God. Beauty attracts and is less threatening. Well proclaimed scriptures, graceful movement especially in partaking of Eucharist, well-chosen and well-done music with full and active participation does leave an impression. Devotions such as Our Lady of Perpetual Help, the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, and Eucharistic Adoration as well as benediction... when done with faith and fervor give powerful testimony.

Fifth, we need to emphasize the importance of the mass and receiving the Eucharist. Being friendly, welcoming and happy to be gathered together set a great tone. Participating by listening (paying attention), responding and singing give witness. Preachers need to give homilies which engage, nurture and challenge the community. Mass can offer great reassurance and comfort which can be most appreciated during difficult times.

As church leads one beyond the world, it shouldn't surprise us that those who only believe in the world, find faith weird. Loving your enemies and praying for those who persecute you certainly can be seen as foolish and weird... but this shouldn't keep us taking up our cross each day and following Him... even when others don't believe.
