From Fr. Bill

Ordinary time? I have enough life experience to know what is considered "ordinary" is constantly changing. I remember elevator operators, rotary phones, leaded gas, television stations signing off, prayer in public schools, first graders walking to school (in rain or light snow), cigarette dispensers in hospitals, and computers the size of our church hall that my cellphone has more computing power than.

The thing that is most ordinary is change. This change is often called progress... but Christians know that we must not judge by appearance, but by its fruits. Not all change is a blessing and good, nor is all change necessarily bad even though unfamiliar or causing discomfort. We are called to not evaluate by intention but by consequences and outcomes. Just because it is new or different does not mean that it is actually better.

We live in interesting times. The changes which have occurred in the last year have pushed many to isolation, depression, poverty and levels of stress and fear which do effect our physical, mental, emotional and spiritual health. Outward forces are what they are. I have the power and choice of how I choose to react, respond and adapt to these signs of the times.

This is our world today. I won't claim it is easy... but we need to accept it and deal with it. Lord, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, the courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference. As the baptized, I am an agent of God's mercy, forgiveness and love.

Ordinary Time actually comes from counting the days and weeks of our life. (Ordinal numbers: 1st, 2nd, third vs Cardinal numbers which say how many there are: 1, 2, 3) Think of a bride preparing for her June Wedding. The days are moving quickly. Once they are finished, you can't get them back. These days and weeks are being used in preparation. Things need to be worked on. Contacts need to be made. Choices are made that for good or poor will need to be embraced and made the best of. Music chosen, perhaps dances learned, and so many people that we need to work with... keeping her eyes on the prize in

spite of adversity and difficulties. Tears will be shed, but with commitment, hard-work and God's grace... all things are possible.

As Catholics we know that each day is an opportunity to make a difference. "God's will be done" is what we are called to be working upon. We realize that avoiding sin is an essential part of this, yet we also know that this is not enough. Dorothy Day, founder of the Catholic Worker Movement believed that for Catholics, each day we should practicing the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy... and these are our marching orders for helping God's will to be done.

The Corporal Works of Mercy are feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, clothing the naked, offering hospitality to the stranger, caring for the sick, visiting the imprisoned, burying the dead. The Spiritual Works of Mercy are admonishing the sinner, instructing the ignorant, counseling the doubtful, comforting the sorrowful, bearing wrongs patiently, forgiving all injuries and finally praying for the living and the dead.

What I appreciate about the works of mercy is that even lying in a hospital bed I can be comforting, counseling, bearing patiently, forgiving and praying. Even covid cannot prevent us from living our faith as practicing Catholics. Disciple's of Christ don't make excuses, they use the days are given to make a difference in helping God's kingdom to come.

Update: **We are encouraging families to use the church for funeral services.** Wind and rain disrupt and discourage those who gather to remember, mourn and comfort family and friends over the loss of their loved one.

For your consideration, I want St. Jerome, as much as possible, to be able to safely and consistently offer the sacraments to the faithful. Visitation and St. Paul, the Apostle (among others) have become virtual only churches with communion and confession unavailable at this time. I want people to be able to visit and receive the Blessed Sacrament. For us at St. Jerome's, I believe (with current circumstances) our outdoor services offer the more sustainable practices during these pandemic days. Thank you for your bearing patiently, forgiving and praying for your priests.



St. Jerome Bible Study will begin a study of the Gospel According to Mark via Zoom on **January 12, from 7:30pm to 9pm**. The study will run for 11 weeks on Tuesday evenings. The commentary and study guide can be purchased from Little Rock Scripture Study.

Mark is the shortest of the four gospels, Mark is the earliest account of Jesus' life. Mark asks everyone to answer Jesus' question, "Who do you say that I am?" and challenges believers in every generation to accept the reality of the cross.

January 22nd is the anniversary of the Supreme Court decisions legalizing abortion in the U.S. More than 59 million unborn boys and girls have died as a result of the 1973 Roe v. Wade and Die v. Bolton Supreme Court decisions.

The USCCB has designated that date as a national "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children." Last year's Memorial Candle Service at the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels featured the lighting of 220 candles—one for each child surgically aborted on an average day in the Los Angeles Archdiocese. Parking-Lot Etiquette Reminders

1. If you plan to park and move closer to the altar, please park your car further away so that others might be able to use your "nearer the altar parking spot" for mass. The parking spots in front of the outside chapel marked with cones are only for vehicles that have a driver and/or passenger inside zooming the mass.
2. Those leaving their cars to sit/stand outside in any of the property/parking lot area should park on the school side parking lot or at the Eastern side of the church lot closest to La Tijera. (This arrangement allows those who do not wish to leave their vehicles to attend mass AND helps the priest and ministers during communion and offertory since they spend time approaching vehicles only to discover there is no one in the car.)
3. It is not appropriate to try go from car to car seeking a seat. If we notice anyone going from vehicle to vehicle seeking admittance, they will be asked to leave as car-hoppers put both beggar and host at risk
4. Know that if you invite someone into your car, even when wearing masks, within less than 15 minutes you will be sharing both air and germs with each other.
