Fr. Bill's Musings

November is a month to remember. All Saints' Day, a Holy Day of Obligation, starts us off and the next day we have All Souls' Day.

In this month of the Holy Souls we are encouraged to recall those who have helped us become the people we are: family, friends and others. It is good to spend time to recall and give thanks to those we owe so much. And saying a prayer for them or doing some act of charity or compassion in memory of them is a sign that they remain alive in our heart. Visiting their grave site is also a noble thing to do. "I remember and appreciate having you in my life. You made a difference for me. I thank God for you."

Mass Intentions

Arranging to have Mass offered for a departed loved one, for someone sick, celebrating a Birthday, an Anniversary or some other special intention is a long-standing tradition for Catholics.

The church has the custom of each mass being sponsored by someone in honor of someone. This person's donation for that mass is meant to reduce or cover the expenses for that particular service: bread, wine, candles, electricity and other essential elements.

A particular mass may only be sponsored by one person, but they may pray for two or three different people.

The person sponsoring the mass does receive a card with the date and time of the mass they are sponsoring and the intention they have requested to be remembered and prayed for in a special way that day. The mass intention is general publicly prayed for during the intercessions following the homily.

On December 1, 2022 we will begin booking masses for 2023. You can mail the request for a Mass intention along with the stipend to the Rectory office. You can phone a request during business hours with the parish secretary, who's also available at the 8am & 10am Sunday masses outside in the parking lot. 


ALL SAINTS DAY
