## Fr. Bill's Musings

I used to think that the purpose of news papers and programs was to inform us of what is happening in our neighborhoods, our state, our country and the world. When I went to college I first heard the phrase "If it bleeds, it leads." Pictures and video seemed essential to be deemed worthy of being news.

When I lived in Canada I came to realize that real bias in news is not just in HOW you present the stories, but rather WHAT was chosen to be ignored and not to be covered at all. Thousands could be starving in Africa, and millions could be enslaved in China... but were not mentioned... even with news programming 24/7. Children are being murdered in Baltimore and Chicago every week. Who decided that their deaths are not worth mentioning? About some things the news room philosophy seems to be "See no evil. Hear no evil. Speak no evil." And about the favored targets and themes, "See no good. Hear no good. Speak no good."

Now it appears the purpose of news is to get people agitated and angry. People who are anxious are much more likely to want to be "in the know" and ready for the tribulations which are being proclaimed.

I find this constant mantra that "the sky is falling" exhausting. No wonder the top killer of young adults (18-45) is drug abuse (fentanyl). They are presented a world of selfishness, hatred, anger, resentment, loneliness and despair. Having been taught to reject God, self-medicating may seem the only way to survive in a world emptied of hope.

When you are fed a diet of things to get you upset, it is no wonder that people will take these things personally and like the three women in New York who trashed a restaurant for having raised its prices... strike out in frustration at those who are trapped in the same neighborhood and world... and like you, who are just trying to survive and make ends meet.

Anger justifies its violence. Hatred blinds us to truth. Satan rejoices in exaggeration, half-truths, over-generalizations and accusations... while Jesus weeps.

Obi-wan Kenobi is not our only hope but rather it is our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. We are the witnesses to this. Our lives are the gospel we are chosen to proclaim. Like Tigger (the tiger of Winnie the Pooh fame) we need to face the world with joy, hope and peace that the world can not give. We know that through our sharing in the sufferings of Christ, we also share in His resurrection. We chose to love and forgive. We chose to not to be a people of anger and resentment, but of compassion and mercy. Who is my neighbor? Even those who hate us for believing and acting on our hope that Jesus is Lord.


