Good news doesn't bring viewers back nor get your website the hits they need to make money. Fear and anxiety bring people back to keep "informed" and "concerned" so the media can get their advertising dollars. They have a motive to keep us anxious and returning for the latest.

Our children continue to struggle with stress and anxiety that they are not ready to deal with. They need adults with strong arms and a sense of confidence that although there are challenges, we trust in God. We will somehow make it through this mess.

I know of adults who are no longer living life, but have self-cocooned themselves to stay alive. Loneliness, depression and meaninglessness often effect those who live in solitary confinement... which is why solitary confinement is considered by many as cruel and unusual punishment. "It is not good for man to be alone" speaks to our need for human connection and not just virtual relationships. Drug abuse and alcohol use help some numb the emptiness that has become their days.

We need to be with people. We are better when we are able to uplift other's lives. You can feel alone in a group, but united with others in heart, mind and action helps us be connected. When we know we belong with these others we are more aware of the meaning and purpose of our life.

I recall giving a man dying of cancer the last rites a year ago in May. He wasn't afraid of death, but rather living. "My family and friends aren't allowed to visit because of the threats of covid. The doctors and staff who have been working with me these last eight weeks are always masked and gloved for my protection. The only faces I've seen here are on television. Father, I am terrified. I can't stand living this way. I miss seeing people. I miss really being with people." God answered his prayers a few days later releasing him to come to the heavenly banquet.

I am grateful that at a recent hospital visit, the nurses kindly ignored covid restrictions for a dying man to allow all his children to have the chance to be with him. ("Just don't let the administrators know.") Hands held, voices raised, tears and smiles flowing... Jesus is present when we gather in His name. It was for me a powerful and profound encounter with our Savior.

"Be not afraid" and "Fear not" are said at least 365 times in the Bible. When fear keeps us apart from God and one another, Satan rejoices. Trusting in God isn't always easy. This might be why the apostles begged Jesus to increase their faith. He let them know that if they even had a mustard seed's worth, they would be able to experience the amazing. God has us covered. We need to do our part by trusting Him and not letting fear keep us apart. "Peace be with you."

Some people are existing in a life of fear and anxiety. They need our pity. They need our prayers. They have become ensnared and are desperate. Peace? There is no room for that among their fears and anxiety.

Do be wise. Do use good sense. Please don't let fear box you in and keep you from living life. People need people. We humans need Jesus.

The bread of life is available. The real presence of God is accessible. We need Him now, more than ever. Why not accept His invitation to take and eat His Body... His flesh for the life of the world?

All our St. Jerome Masses are inside our church. The 8am and 10am masses will continue to be zoomed. For those participating from the outdoor chapel, communion will be available as usual. Following mass the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed at the outdoor chapel until Benediction at 3:15pm.

On Thanksgiving Day we will have an 8am and 10am mass. Both will be zoomed. I am thankful that my mom will be joining us for mass. Know that you are welcomed, as well.



Dead (D) Thanksgiving (T) Special Intention (SI)

### Mass Intentions

Arranging to have Mass offered for a departed loved one, for someone sick, celebrating a Birthday, an Anniversary or some other special intention is a long-standing tradition for Catholics.

The church has the custom of each mass being sponsored by someone in honor of someone. The suggested stipend for a weekday Mass is \$10 and \$20 for a Sunday Mass. This person's donation for that mass is meant to reduce or cover the expenses for that particular service: bread, wine, candles, electricity and other essential elements. A particular mass may only be sponsored by one person, but they may pray for two or three different people.

The person sponsoring the mass does receive a card with the date and time of the mass they are sponsoring and the intention they have requested to be remembered and prayed for in a special way that day. The mass intention is publicly prayed for during the intercessions following the homily.
