## From Fr. Bill

Dudley Sweeney. Singing. Cheerful. Hopeful. I was surprised to find out that he had died unexpectedly last Friday. He was at mass the Sunday before singing with passion and joy. Dudley and his wife, Dori, lectored regularly on Sundays... even through covid. A year ago, September 2019 he and Dori celebrated their marriage of Fifty Years along with their children and grandchildren. I will miss seeing Dudley on Sundays. He lived in this world fully alive and I believe that he continues to be fully alive in our Lord and savior, Jesus Christ.

Lawrence Ashley. He and his wife, Mildred, were a cute couple who were faithful, cheerful and peace-filled members of St. Jerome's. Sunday Mass was an important part of every week for them. When Mildred passed in 2016, Lawrence continued to come... but he moved further back in church... maybe to overlook the place where he and Mildred used to pray together? I was surprised but not surprised to hear that Lawrence joined Mildred in December. I know that he had been missing being with her in this world and was looking forward to being with her in the next. I am grateful for Lawrence's prayers and encouragement.

Joan Duhe. She was a Saturday 5:30pm mass regular: front row, walker assisted, dedicated and determined. When covid hit, Joan was one of the people who immediately sprang into my mind as being at most risk. Since June she has been anointed at least four times as she continued to zoom mass through her phone. She fell just before Thanksgiving and has been in declining health since then. I gave her that fourth anointing last Sunday afternoon. She was attentive, responsive and alert, yet while her spirit was willing, her flesh was weak. Joan's sufferings ended this morning, Tuesday, January 26. Her last words to me were a promise to keep me and our St. Jerome community in her prayers.

I believe in the power of prayer. I know that when two or three of us unite our hearts and minds in prayer, there is power. I get irritated when I hear people say in a negative way that someone or a group is "ONLY PRAYING" in response to adversity, trial or situation. I know

the prayer and intercession of Moses helped God's people in battle. My grandfather, a surgeon, spoke many times of the miracles that were worked through his hands during operations in amazing ways through the power of prayer. I have seen people's hearts and lives changed through the power of prayer.

I guess for non-believers prayer may look like a waste of time, but for Christians we know that some battles can only be won through prayer and fasting.

Speaking of prayer and fasting, Lent will begin this year on February 17. Yes, it is Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday is NOT a Holy Day of Obligation, however, that all are welcome to receive the blest ashes on their head has made it remarkably popular. "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." Covid has assisted in reminding us that you can hide from death, but you can't really escape it. In point of fact, we Christians view death as the gateway to eternal life... and that to die well, we need to live well. In dying we gain eternal life.

Distribution of Ashes will be different... and actually more biblically accurate. Back in biblical times ashes were placed upon one's head as a sign of repentance... not with an artistic cross on the forehead and a sprinkle of ash upon one's nose. For non-contact purposes the blessed ashes will be showered/sprinkled on top of your head if you wish to receive.

On Ash Wednesday we will be having mass with Ashes distributed at 8am. We will have services at noon, 3pm and 5pm. These afternoon services will not include Eucharist. Ashes will not be available at the church office.

Beginning in Lent we will be adding an additional mass opportunity for our Catholic community at noon on Sundays. This "zoomless" mass will be inside the church with the basic rules of masks, appropriate social distancing, and sanitizing before and after mass. Attendance will be limited so tickets will be available seven days before the service at the church office or with Roxanne the Sunday before, at her outdoor table. More details will follow.

Prayer has power. More than ever we need to use this God given gift to unite with Him.

The season of Lent begins on **Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021**. We would like to invite you to make this Lent a time of real spiritual growth for your family and our parish community. **Ashes will be distributed at the 8am Mass on Ash Wednesday, as well as at the 12 Noon, 3pm and 5:00pm Ash Services.**

## Fast and Abstinence

As Friday was the day of Jesus' suffering and death, the Church asks Catholics to **abstain from eating meat on all the Fridays of Lent as well as on Ash Wednesday.**

**On ASH WEDNESDAY and GOOD FRIDAY we FAST.** Fasting means eating no more than one full meal and 2 lighter meals for the day. No snacking is allowed, but fluid does not break the fast. Adults are bound to fast till beginning their 60th year.

**ABSTINANCE** forbids the eating of meat for those who are of age of 14 years and older.
