Rosary - following 8am daily Mass

From Fr. Bill

Two hundred young men are on their knees before the Blessed Sacrament praying with an intensity and devotion that might lead you to think today will be the time for Christ's second coming. This happens each Friday of the fall. It is football game day at St. John Bosco.

I too use to pray for victory. I wanted us to crush the Cubs, to torment the Saints, to martyr the Friars and to slash the Swordsmen. WE were the Braves: on the field, on the bench, in the stands. We were the Braves. I was in the stands, shouting and cheering. Later, when I came back to Bosco as a priest I moved down to the field as chaplain. (I also coached one freshman game vs. Long Beach Poly. I have a loosing record.)

Over time I grew to realize that the Cubs, Saints, Friars and Swordsman might be praying to scalp the Braves... and I came to realize that what I desired so much, didn't mean much when it came to salvation and being a disciple. These opponents are my brothers. I am called to be happy when they are happy and sad when they are sad. I have played teams that whether you won or lost, you left feeling tainted because of their parents and players behavior (spat-on and cursed as you walked in and out). I have seen Friars lose with grace and dignity, leaving me impressed with their character. I have been defeated by Bishop Amat and yet felt uplifted by their sportsmanship and respect. Victory comes in not loosing yourself in the midst of emotion and conflict, winning or loosing.

God's will wasn't that we win. He might allow us to win, rather God's will is that we learn and grow to be better instruments of His presence. Praying that we do our best and that no one gets injured is good. But when I make the game the most important thing, it is becoming my false god and I am in danger of loosing myself.

It's funny. Those championships and trophies seemed so important. God alone knows the hours and sacrifices willingly given: playing through pain, weight room, film, bus trips, repetition, sweat, getting your homework done... to make it happen. Yet it is the friendships and lessons learned that you grow to most appreciate.

Do my desires correspond with God's desires? If they do, then I know that I have God's blessing. But of course, batteries are not included and assembly on my part will be required. Prayer isn't magic. We pray knowing that everything depends on God. We act knowing that we are responsible for respecting and using the time, talents and opportunities He gives us to make it reality.

"Father, I am here for Adoration. How or what am I supposed to do for Adoration?"

If you are a beginner or perhaps looking for other possibilities when making a visit to the Blessed Sacrament for adoration, here are some things I find fruitful:

You could share with Him what fills your heart and mind: concerns, hopes, and people... placing them in His loving presence.

You could "Abide" in His presence. Look with love and adore the one who is Savior and Lord. Rest in His amazing presence and be grateful for all He has given to me.

You could pray the Rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet.

You could read scripture and when you reach a word or phrase that touches you, sit with this for a little bit. Find a phrase to carry with you for the rest of the day.

Examine your conscience. What things do I need to take responsibility for and need to adjust or change? What one action or behavior can I focus on for the next day?

Recall people and things you are grateful for. Count your blessings and nurture your spirit of gratitude.

Sing (In your imagination, or with your earbuds... listen or if you are alone with Him... out loud) a sacred hymn which connects you to your church and Lord.

Prepare for next Sunday by "pre-reading" the Sunday's readings... or the next day's scriptures.

Make a list of people and things you should be praying for. Individually, call each person or thing to mind and place them in His merciful hands and heart.

Tell Him what you most need. It is important not only to pray for others but to also to ask, seek, and knock for ourselves.

The Liturgy of the Hours or Christian Prayer is a great pray resource to add to your tool kit. I use the **IBreviary** application on my phone. I also use an audio version:

I know artists who sketch biblical scenes and images of the saints. I know people who find journaling a fruitful way to spend time with the Lord. There are probably as many ways to "rest" in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, as there are people. The bottom line is to make time to watch and pray with the Lord and allow His presence to transform us.

Our Mother of Perpetual Help Novena

On Sunday June 27th at 11:30am the Novena will be held in front of the Outside Altar. We will have a rosary procession into the church for mass at noon.



1. All religious services are allowed to take place indoors without capacity limitations, social distancing, and/or prearranged "reservation" systems.
2. Parishes can open for prayer group meetings, ministerial gatherings, and social gatherings provided that sensible public health precautions are observed. (With cleaning and summer weather, August appears to be our goal for these re-openings.)
3. Masks are not required for fully vaccinated individuals outdoors or indoors for religious services. **Non-vaccinated people are asked to wear masks indoors.**
4. Volunteers "working" at mass will be required to wear masks when working in the church.
5. Hand sanitation must be available for all visitors.
6. Liturgical singing can take place.
7. Communion will only be under the form of bread. Communion on the hand is strongly encouraged but communion on the tongue is now permitted.
8. Liturgical processions may resume (e.g. Presentation of the Gifts)
9. Holy Water will be available in the vestibule. Bring your own container for your personal use.
