God-incidents or maybe guardian angels working on overdrive? "UCLA Medical Center ICU on the eighth floor. I am leaving now."

I park my car in an underground lot. I am directed to an elevator. I go up. I change elevators to get to the upper floors. Within two minutes of arrival I am by her bedside. Her husband is there. "Heart attack. Unconscious." We pray. I anoint her and give her the blessing. Her husband thanks me and I leave.

Only as I am waiting for the elevator do I start to think how sloppy the security is here. At any other hospital I am questioned, covid screened, checked-in and given a visitor pass.

I go down what I think is the same elevator I came up. I exit on what I think is the same floor I got on and although the security person who directed me to that elevator seems to be the same man... I am now questioned for not having a visitor pass. Also, a hall I didn't notice when I first arrived, now is very visible with covid-screening, information check-ins and a line of people waiting to get their visitor passes. I ended up needing to get covid-screened to reach the parking garage elevator.

How did I miss all these things? Maybe I got off on a different floor? But what I do know is that was the fastest time I have had in the covid era to reach someone's bedside... and I don't know how it happened. It is just another God-incident in my life and I am grateful. He often gives unexpected blessings.

"Father, give me a moment before we begin the funeral. I need to greet the people." He goes up to the microphone for this zoomed service and reads the pages of prepared text. It lasted five to seven minutes. I am a guest presider so, when in Rome....

This man repeated several times over the duration of his lecture that the archbishop was most concerned about people's health and safety are a priority. He stated that it was no longer necessary for the faithful to attend mass in person as we have been dispensed by the archbishop. He recommended that people receive Spiritual Communion as it is safer for everyone. He seemed to say that people did not need to receive communion. He explained that those in attendance could sit or stand, but that singing or coming in contact with others was prohibited. They were to only be near members of their own household regardless of their relationships and a minimum six foot spacing would be required and enforced for their own safety. For their safety Communion would not be given during mass but might be received as they exit to the parking-lot. They were not to visit with others in the parking-lot, but rather should move quickly to their own car and exit the property.

I failed to mention that this service required tickets and had prearranged assigned seating. I also failed to mention that these people were mostly family and that the seniors had been responsible and gotten

their vaccine. I accept one can't presume that.

Many of the things he said: masks, distancing and households are our policies as well. Yet the way it was presented gave a clear message: you are selfish and dangerous if you are here. We wish you had not come here... which is why we stream our services. I must state that Spiritual Communion can never give what the actual sacrament gives to us. Given everything he had lectured us about, if I wasn't the priest for this funeral mass, I might have left.

The setting for this outside garden mass was nice enough. The musician singer played music which couldn't but call one to tap a foot, sway, clap, and sing out an "amen" or "alleluia." But her family and friends sat unmoving. They sat in silence. They did not want to be told to leave this "Celebration of life."

She had been a woman who wouldn't sit still and who never let her companion, lupus, keep her from living and uplifting others. The eulogies testified that although she offered up her sufferings, they had never heard a word of self-pity or complaint for the cross she had been chosen to bear. She was not just the life of the party, she helped plan and coordinate celebrations and parties for others.

She would have been dancing, hands raised high and her voice singing God's praise. She had reason to fear, but she chose to live her life not controlled by fear. Her infectious smile and spirit of peace, hope and joy will be greatly missed. I am sure she had a hand in the gospel style music which tried to set a mood and tone of hope and joy. I too gave my best but this gathering of church had been straight-jacked with little room for hospitality, joy and life.

Her parents came to me at the end of mass, grateful, and asked if they were allowed to receive communion. They had been confused by the instructions before the service. At their daughter's funeral they dearly wanted to be able to receive Eucharist as they desired the power of the Real Presence in the Sacrament at this time of mourning and joy.

I get the feeling that some people want reception of the sacraments put online until a time when things are completely safe. (Online is not close to the same as being there!) Requiring that covid no longer exist means perhaps never again. Only one virus, smallpox, has ever been eradicated and it still might exist waiting to be used as a weapon by some nation.

How far should I allow fear of death to diminish quality of life? The suicide rates of children and teens as well as the number of people suffering from depression and drug abuse remind us that there are things just as deadly as covid. Even having received vaccines some remain entombed. The world has never been and will never be completely safe. Jesus' liberating words "be not afraid" were to strengthen us in face of panic and anxiety about things of this world.

On this Good Shepherd Sunday do pray for priests and bishops. We need your prayers for what is needed to be good shepherds in a fear-filled country.


