## From Fr. Bill

Beginning Sunday, February 21st we will be adding an additional mass at noon on Sundays. This mass will be inside the church with basic rules of masks, appropriate social distancing, and sanitizing before and after mass. Attendance will be limited. Tickets are available the seven days before the service at the rectory office or the prior Sunday with Roxanne at her outdoor table by the hall.



### **ST. MARTIN DE PORRES**

St. Martin is the only black saint from the Western Hemisphere so far. (Father Augustus Tolton may be joining him soon.) Martin was born in Lima, Peru, in

1579. His mother was a freed slave from Panama, and his father was a Spanish gentleman who did not want him because of his facial features and skin color. Early in his life, he demonstrated humility, charity for the poor and a love for animals, and devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

When he was 12, his mother apprenticed him to a barber. I am sure you have noticed the colors of barber polls: red for blood and white for bandages (in the US it includes a blue stripe for some reason). So Martin learned how to cut hair and also how to care for wounds, prepare and administer medicines as well as how to "bleed" patients with prolonged fevers. (Yes, it did bring the fever down but thankfully this is no longer recognized among best medical practices.)

After a few years in this, Martin applied to the Dominicans (feeling unworthy to be a religious brother) to be a "lay helper." After nine years of devoted service, during which time he gained the nick-name "the saint of the broom" for his willingness to do whatever was needed, the Dominicans changed their regulation that "no black

person may be received to the holy habit or profession of our order" and requested him to take vows and become a religious brother because of the example of his prayer, penance, charity and humility. Martin was vested in the full habit and professed solemn vows as a Dominican brother.

His days were filled with nursing the sick and caring for the poor. His nights were filled with prayer. Unusual for the time, he treated all people regardless of their color, race, or status. He was instrumental in founding an orphanage, took care of slaves brought from Africa, and managed the daily alms of the Dominicans with practicality, as well as generosity.

Martin routinely begged more than \$2,000 a week from the rich, which was turned into food, clothing, medicine for the poor of the city as well as dowries for poor girls so that they could marry or enter a convent. People throughout the area went to Martin when they needed help in matters of "blankets, shirts, candles, candy, miracles or prayers!"

Side by side with his daily work in the kitchen, laundry, and infirmary, Martin's life reflected God's extraordinary gifts: ecstasies that lifted him into the air, light filling the room where he prayed, bi-location, miraculous knowledge, instantaneous cures, and a remarkable rapport with animals. His charity extended to beasts of the field and even to the vermin of the kitchen. He would excuse the raids of mice and rats on the grounds that they were underfed; he kept stray cats and dogs at his sister's house.

Many of his fellow religious took Martin as their spiritual director, but he continued to call himself a "poor slave." He was a good friend of another Dominican saint of Peru, St. Rose of Lima. Martin died on November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1639. As the church celebrates the day of death on earth as our birthday into heaven so, of course, when Martin was formally recognized as a saint in 1962, this was the date chosen for his feast day.
