Brothers and sisters: Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen. Because of it the ancients were well attested.

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; he went out, not knowing where he was to go. By faith he sojourned in the promised land as in a foreign country, dwelling in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs of the same promise; for he was looking forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and maker is God. By faith he received power to generate, even though he was past the normal age—and Sarah herself was sterile—for he thought that the one who had made the promise was trustworthy. So it was that there came forth from one man, himself as good as dead, descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sands on the seashore.

From the Gospel according to Luke (Lk 12:32-48)

Jesus said to his disciples: "Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom. Sell your belongings and give alms. Provide money bags for yourselves that do not wear out, an inexhaustible treasure in heaven that no thief can reach nor moth destroy. For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be.

"Gird your loins and light your lamps and be like servants who await their master's return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival. Amen, I say to you, he will gird himself, have them recline at table, and proceed to wait on them. And should he come in the second or third watch and find them prepared in this way, blessed are those servants. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour when the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."

Then Peter said, "Lord, is this parable meant for us or for everyone?" And the Lord replied, "Who, then, is the faithful and prudent steward whom the master will put in charge of his servants to distribute the food allowance at the proper time? Blessed is that servant whom his master on arrival finds doing so. Truly, I say to you, the master will put the servant in charge of all his property. But if that servant says to himself, 'My master is delayed in coming,' and begins to beat the menservants and the maidservants, to eat and drink and get drunk, then that servant's master will come on an unexpected day and at an unknown hour and will punish the servant severely and assign him a place with the unfaithful. That servant who knew his master's will but did not make preparations nor act in accord with his will shall be beaten severely; and the servant who was ignorant of his master's will but acted in a way deserving of a severe beating shall be beaten only lightly. Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more."

Fr. Bill's Musings

"We don't want a mass. We want a celebration of life! We want everyone to come up and have a chance to talk and share their memories. It should be about our feelings about the deceased and the amazing things they did for us... that they will live forever in our hearts and will be missed."

When I die, I want a funeral mass. There is power in the Eucharist and the mass. It is the most perfect prayer of which we can partake. I am not arrogant enough to presume heaven. I want the sacrament which unites heaven and earth, God and man, to offer for me the sacrifice and gift of Christ's life. I know I need God's mercy and forgiveness. I also know that those who attend might be convicted by the presence of Christ in Word and in Sacrament. Perhaps they may pause to consider where their choices are leading them? Encountering Christ's presence does change hearts and lives.

I want people praying for me. I have fallen short of what God has called me to be. (Some of which I did not realize or remember and may not have confessed) Being in a person's heart is fine, but if it isn't Jesus' heart, it really doesn't matter. In this world I'm with the tax collector asking, "Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner." I know I am not worthy, yet I also know God loves me. I know that death is not the end, but a transition from the Pilgrim Church, to (I PRAY) the beginning of my participation in the Church Penitent (Holy Souls in Purgatory) or the Church Triumphant (Saints in Heaven). I will be grateful for either of these rather than elsewhere. Please pray for me. Know that I am praying for you, my brothers and sisters here at St. Jerome, whither I am pilgrim, penitent or victor.

I pray for those I love who have gone before me. Although I may believe they are in heaven, I will not presume and miss the opportunity to assist a Holy Soul who might need my/our intercession to get them through those heavenly gates. As we remember them and pray for them, Jesus, our Lord and Savior, is united in our prayer with them and for them. (I might not have much pull but when two or three ask in His name, wow.) Just because I can't see you, doesn't mean that I will stop praying for you. An honor I can give to those who have gone before me is to remember them in my prayers and do acts of kindness and mercy "paying forward" the love they have given me. And yes, I speak with them and ask for their intercession. We believe relationships don't end with death. They are changed yet the love of Christ joins us together.

Don't depend on your relatives to plan your funeral service... **especially** if they no longer practice the faith. You might end up watching "A Celebration of Life!" with great food, drink, and stories... realizing you still need someone's assistance for you to enter into the greatest Celebration of Life, in heaven.
