- 2) on-line via Zoom on Wednesday evenings from 7:30 to 9pm, beginning December 1st



## The Immaculate Conception

### A Holy Day of Obligation

We celebrate Mary's preservation from original sin from the moment of conception.

As November is Black Catholic History Month I think it is good to remind ourselves of an American who needs another confirmed miracle to advance his cause to being acknowledged as a saint. You can help by praying the special prayer for his canonization that simultaneously presents to God a request for healing or other special intention. You can also share the story of Father Tolton and encourage others to use him as one of their payer warriors in the Communion of Saints as his process needs people asking for his interceding for them to God.

Servant of God **AUGUSTUS TOLTON** was born a slave in Ralls County, Missouri, April 1, 1854. With the outbreak of the Civil War, his father escaped to the North to serve in the Union Army. In 1862 his mother set out with her three little ones walking and rowing to freedom. They made their way to Illinois and settled in the town of Quincy. The family began attending a Catholic Church there. Even though the family had escaped from physical slavery, the prejudice against Blacks in the North was not much better as in the South. There was no problem attending Mass with whites, but when she entered her children in the parish school, the parents of some other school children were not accepting. Because of threats the family left the parish, but were welcomed at St. Peter parish and school where Augustus learned to read and write.

As a teen Augustus began displaying an interest in the priesthood. His parish priests encouraged the young man and tried, without success, to enroll him in several diocesan seminaries. In 1878, the Franciscan College in Quincy accepted him as a student, and two years later he enrolled at the college for men studying to be missionary priests in Rome.

After completing his studies, Augustus Tolton was ordained on April 24, 1886. Augustus had assumed he would be sent to the missions. To his surprise he was asked to return to the United States and work in a parish in Illinois. "America needs Negro priests," he was told in Rome, "If the United States has never seen a Black priest, it must see one now. Can you drink from this cup?" Newly ordained Father Tolton replied, "Yes, I can."

Father Tolton's first assignment was Saint Joseph's church in his home town of Quincy. During his two years there he gained enormous respect from many of the German and Irish parishioners, who flocked to Saint Joseph's to sit with their black brothers and sisters in Christ and hear his inspiring sermons. Other pastors invited the gifted preacher to give sermons at their churches as well, and his religious instruction classes were filled with enthusiastic catechumens. However, dissention (including verbal attacks, threats and backstabbing) led by black protestant ministers and a neighboring Catholic pastor led to his transfer to the Archdiocese of Chicago in 1889.

The archbishop assigned him to a poor parish on the south side of the Chicago, Saint Augustine's church, which consisted of a chapel in a basement. He spearheaded the building of Saint Monica's Church which was dedicated in 1894. This would be Father Tolton's parish for life, and it became the center from which he ministered to all the Black Catholics of Chicago.

Father Tolton's reputation as a preacher earned him many speaking opportunities from which he expounded upon the truths of the Faith and the vocation of all to sanctity. He addressed the First Catholic Colored Congress in 1889 in Washington DC. Of Augustus writings only a few of his letters survive. Most of these were written to St. Katharine Drexel, his confidant and a financial supporter for his school. He spoke of the challenges of being the first Black priest in North America. "They're watching me," he once wrote addressing the microscope he seemed to live under.

There were other priests in the United States who were Black, but Father Augustus was the only full-blooded one. The three priests who preceded Father Tolton could "pass" for white. Fr. Tolton had to take all the bigotry, all the insults, and keep his dignity, and the holiness of his priesthood. He helped Black Catholics be proud of their religion in spite of the weaknesses of some Catholics who couldn't free themselves of their prejudice. He was a devoted priest of Jesus Christ, who just happened to be Black.

On a very hot day in July, 1897, while walking home from a day of retreat, Fr. Tolton collapsed on the sidewalk from a heat stroke. He was rushed to Mercy hospital where he died that night. He was only forty-three years old, a priest for more than eleven years.

"May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the sweet fellowship of the Holy Spirit remain with you, now and always, Amen" (2 Corinthians 13:14). SHALOM."

## Mass Intentions

Arranging to have Mass offered for a departed loved one, for someone sick, celebrating a Birthday, an Anniversary or some other special intention is a long-standing tradition for Catholics.

The church has the custom of each mass being sponsored by someone in honor of someone. The suggested stipend for a weekday Mass is \$10 and \$20 for a Sunday Mass. This person's donation for that mass is meant to reduce or cover the expenses for that particular service: bread, wine, candles, electricity and other essential elements. A particular mass may only be sponsored by one person, but they may pray for two or three different people.

The person sponsoring the mass does receive a card with the date and time of the mass they are sponsoring and the intention they have requested to be remembered and prayed for in a special way that day. The mass intention is publicly prayed for during the intercessions following the homily.

**On December 1, 2021 we will begin booking masses for 2022.** You can mail the request for a Mass intention along with the stipend to the Rectory office. You can phone a request during business hours with the parish secretary, who's also available at the 8am & 10am Sunday masses outside in the parking lot.
