Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

(RCIA)

The RCIA is for adults who want to become Catho-
lic, for baptized Christians who wish to become
Catholic and for Catholics who want to complete
the sacraments of initiation (First Communion and
Confirmation). The RCIA is a process of study and
reflection on Catholic Christian teachings, practic-
es and traditions. If you are interested to embark
on this exciting journey please contact: Fr. Bill

When I meet with couples preparing for marriage or planning to baptize a child, I ask them to do an opening prayer and a closing prayer for our meeting. Concern tends to wash over their face, and then a question, "Father, is the Our Father OK?"

The Our Father is more than OK... especially as Jesus gave this prayer to us as an example of how we should pray. The Our Father is now well established and an example of formal prayer.

Catholics tend to be good at formal prayer. At an early age we learn the Sign of the Cross, the Our Father, the Hail Mary, the Glory Be, Grace Before Meals, the Act of Contrition, as well as the other prayers (the Creed, the Confiteor) and responses ("And with your spirit.") used at mass. Formal prayer is an effective way for a group to pray together by using the same words. **Formal prayer** has a "correct" group of words we learn so that are voices and hearts may be united together as one. Hymns we sing in church and in our various devotions are all good examples of formal prayer helping us to praise God as one body in the Lord.

During this Jubilee of the 250 year of the establishment of the Faith in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles (San Gabriel Mission) we are being asked to pray aloud once each week with at least one other person (outside of mass). **Get a prayer buddy!**

Formal prayer are great ways to pray aloud together: The Rosary, The Divine Mercy Chaplet, The St. Michael the Archangel Prayer and an almost infinite collection of other prayers that you may appreciate and could share with your prayer partner.

Informal prayer is speaking from one's heart and allows others to pray for your desires and concerns. Although most protestants I know are ready to jump in with this type of prayer, many Catholics seem hesitant to publicly voice this type of prayer. Perhaps it might be an important part

of their personal prayer but outside of prayer groups, Catholics generally don't practice this form much with others. Why not use your prayer buddy to practice this type of prayer?

If you are unsure of how to do informal prayer here are four steps you might use to get you started. **1: Call on God** (e.g. Heavenly Father, Lord Jesus, Holy Spirit, Dear God) **2: Praise or Thank God** for what He has already done. **3: Ask God** for what you or someone else needs. **4: Amen** (Asking in Jesus' name is good.) The "Amen" lets others know you have concluded your informal prayer. Here is an example which omits the 2nd step... remember it is from your heart. You don't need to make it fancy or complicated, but authentic: "Dear Jesus, be with us. Help us. Amen."
