Rosary - following 8am daily Mass

From Fr. Bill

This last Monday our parishioners, Sonia and Segundo Diaz, celebrated their sixtieth (Yes, 60 years) of married life. Born and raised in Cuba they had to illegally and secretly arrange for a priest friend of theirs to bless their union. It was done in the dark of night where they and a handful of family gathered for confession, mass and their exchange of vows. They and their guests wore their normal work clothes in order to not gain the authorities attention. They were willing to risk imprisonment to become the Sacrament of Marriage. This reminds us that for Catholics it isn't the dress nor the party that makes marriage special, but the presence of Christ.

"Father, when will my mass be in church?"

Please forgive this first answer as I know it isn't what they were asking. Theologically, it already is. Where two or three are gathered in His name, Christ is present. As the baptized we are His Body, the Church.

I don't know yet when the mass he use to attend will be back in the church. (The Sunday noon and five pm Masses are celebrated inside the church with no reservations currently required.) St. Jerome is a beautiful church that I pray we will always be known for our spirit of hospitality and welcome.

This past year has been like a rollercoaster at Magic Mountain. Things have been abruptly and unexpectedly changing from day to day and week to week. This uncertainty seems to be the current norm. Also prudence reminds me that, "Just because you can do something, doesn't mean you should do it."

Last year most Catholics in Los Angeles were denied sacraments for over two months. As your pastor, I never want to put any of the faithful in a similar situation.

I have done and will continue to do everything I am able, to ensure that the greatest number of the faithful are able to fully, consciously and actively celebrate and receive the sacraments.

First, currently, the vast majority of Californians do not believe that "in-person" learning is safe for their children. Our fully vaccinated senators and house members continue to be masked and apparently fearful about being in enclosed spaces. The message that people being together inside buildings is dangerous to one's health and safety, even when vaccinated, has been received and believed. My opinion regarding the nature

and purpose of getting vaccinated does not have the gravity to convince people otherwise.

Second, I love singing and music. As St. Augustine said, "Singing is like praying twice." (i.e. magnifies the effect of the prayer on the singer) Trying to do this kind of prayer, I have choked and gagged with a mask on. My asthma seems to be enkindled when I even try to have conversations wearing a mask. Now that masks are no longer a requirement for outside gatherings, this makes an important aspect of worship more accessible at outside services.

Please note: I miss our choirs. Their spirit and joy uplift me! Their singing is more likely and sooner to be permitted outside by the diocese. Being able to have them sing in the church would motivate me to move more services inside. The diocese is being incredibly careful with anything that that they fear may put people at greater risk. (In harmony with the gospels and as some suggest, attorneys, it seems we strive to be the last, rather than the first.)

Third, our "drive-in" services have helped some of our parishioners return to attending mass. In most cases these are health related issues, including mobility, which make our large, spacious church an obstacle to their attendance. Yes, covid has given a few parishioners the unanticipated gift of access to daily and Sunday Eucharist. I don't want to exclude them from being able to visit the Blessed Sacrament and obeying Jesus' command to "Take and eat."

Fourth, the morning mass outside has been beautiful: the Divine Mercy, the sunlight, flowers, trees, the birds and gentle breeze. I have even found people praying before the Divine Mercy and statues of our Blessed Mother after sunset. From the Rosary Garden to the Stations of the Cross, our parish grounds have become places of prayer which people from San Fernando and Orange County come to visit

By the way, our first mass of the day outside is regularly better attended than the pre-covid version. Something has been attracting more people. Accessibility? Safety? Consistency? Beauty? Or perhaps our Blessed Mother who wants more people to know and love her Son?

I don't know why this is so, but I do know that during difficult times we need to be gathered together with Jesus more than ever. I will continue to strive to remove as many barriers as possible for Catholics to be able to REVERENTLY receive the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Happy Mothers' Day!
