Family dinners at Thanksgiving and Christmas can seem like a minefield. We can pick our friends, but not our family. Sometimes fear, anger and tension can almost be tasted in the eggnog.

In our own families and in the church I believe that tension is often a sign of the presence of the Holy Spirit calling both people or parties to growth and spiritual maturity. For the Spirit to be effective requires honesty, trust, respect and humility. Keep in mind that "different" is not necessarily wrong or evil. Saints Peter and Paul challenged each other to more and better. People who pray together such as Saint Philip Neri, Saint Charles Borromeo and Giovanni Palestrina (who composed music for their prayer group) helped each other through loving "fraternal" correction. Tension can motivate us to learn and change.

Our starting point as Christians is not being right... but being loving. I am not talking about warm feelings but rather the commitment to "I truly want what is best for you." My definition of love does not include accepting all of a person's choices and behavior but focuses on compassion and wanting the good for them. If my heart is filled with anger or hate, Christ and the Spirit are not present. If everything they say or do triggers me, although they may be in the wrong, I am in need of a new heart and spirit. (That I have given them this much power in my life is something I need to have the wisdom and courage to own.) If I am unable to recognize any good in this person made by God, I do not love God and I have locked Him out.

If Christ is in my heart the fruits of the Holy Spirit will dwell in me: Gentleness, Self-control, Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Generosity, and Faithfulness. These are the fruits of a life lived in the Spirit of Jesus. Please note that their absence suggests we have not trusted God and learned to surrender to life in His Spirit. "My will be done" leads to different fruits that putting God and the needs of those He calls us to love before our selfish interests. Disciples strive to live in His Word, look for opportunities to serve (foot washing) and bring Jesus' merciful and loving presence to others.

Do be aware of any individual (my way or the highway) or group who believes they know all the answers. Those who believe their way is the only way, that their viewpoint is the only truth and that submission as well as obedience to their perspective is the best path to life... have a level of arrogance and pride which is frightening. Hold tight to Christ. We have only one Lord and teacher... and we are all HIS students still in need of learning.

For many people, the first reaction to tension with another is to seek allies. I sow gossip and my opinion in order to overwhelm my opponent. I will present myself as the innocent victim in need of protection and support, while purifying and modifying my

contributions to these tensions. Jesus would call this trying to lead by "Lording it over others" and St. Paul would call this person out as a cancer on the Body of Christ, planting division as a gossip and busy body. Please remember that what people speak about others usually reveals themselves, more than the other. Please pray for these brothers and sisters who are perhaps ensnared in self-pity, self-righteousness or pride. People who "claim" they have forgiven another or gotten over something... yet keep on talking about it to keep it fresh for them and the others they meet... they have not forgiven and the stories they spread testify to their apparent self-deception.

As a Christian, tension calls for me to examine my conscience and behavior. This is an opportunity for growth! Are my words and behaviors revealing the presence of God or perhaps distorting or concealing its light? Humility and the knowledge that we are each continually striving to be more like Christ helps us to better practice living our faith. We each have blind spots... that beam or speck in our own eye... which makes it all too easy to recognize another's challenges and areas for growth while making it difficult for me to accept or admit that I, as well, is still in process in my journey with Christ.

Speaking to one person for counsel or to gain clarity is a prudent step, but if I am running for person to person and group to group acting light Paul Revere... I am out of order and am attacking the compassion, forgiveness and mercy we are called to live as the Body of Christ.

Matthew 18:15-17 is a great guide to use in dealing with tension. "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have won over your brother. If he does not listen, take one or two others along with you, so that every fact may be established on the testimony of two or three witnesses. If he refuses to listen to them, tell the church. If he refuses to listen even to the church, then treat him as you would a Gentile or a tax collector."

In speaking directly, we can learn about ourselves and how my behavior is being perceived. As you speak to the one or two (counsel and clarity, not politics) you may discover your own feet of clay. Bringing it to the church brings the light to both our behavior and may bring understanding and healing. Finally, if it is serious enough to merit treating them as a gentile or tax-collector, remember how Jesus mixed with, listened to, encouraged and invited these people. We are to forgive as we wish to be forgiven... which doesn't mean I have to trust them... but I do need to find pity and learn to love them: Wanting the good and the best for them.

So, as Thanksgiving Dinner approaches, be open to the growth, forgiveness and love tension may bring to your family's gathering. Recognize it as the opportunity it is in centering my life in Jesus and His Holy Spirit.

Mass Intentions

Arranging to have Mass offered for a departed loved one, for someone sick, celebrating a Birthday, an Anniversary or some other special intention is a long-standing tradition for Catholics.

The church has the custom of each mass being sponsored by someone in honor of someone. The suggested stipend for a weekday Mass is \$10 and \$20 for a Sunday Mass. This person's donation for that mass is meant to reduce or cover the expenses for that particular service: bread, wine, candles, electricity and other essential elements. A particular mass may only be sponsored by one person, but they may pray for two or three different people.

The person sponsoring the mass does receive a card with the date and time of the mass they are sponsoring and the intention they have requested to be remembered and prayed for in a special way that day. The mass intention is publicly prayed for during the intercessions following the homily.

On December 1, 2021 we will begin booking masses for 2022. You can mail the request for a Mass intention along with the stipend to the Rectory office. You can phone a request during business hours with the parish secretary, who's also available at the 8am & 10am Sunday masses outside in the parking lot.
