We are all called to give witness by our lives and to become a bridge to bring people to Jesus and the gift of salvation. Baptism is the sacrament which offers us a living relationship as the chosen: adopted sons and daughters of God.

Do you have a friend or family member who might be interested in being baptized? Do you know anyone wishing to become Catholic? (It can be you!) Or have you or another not made their *First Communion or Confirmation*? You are invited to the **St. Jerome RCIA program**. The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults will begin in the Fall. We meet for an hour a week at 7pm on Zoom. The Sacraments will be discussed in detail as well as other topics such as the bible, prayer, and the Holy Spirit.

This week we are hosting a missionary from Archdiocese of Imphal, India. His name is **Fr. Aloysius Seiba**. He will be speaking at all the masses this weekend.

Here is some background Fr. Aloysius asked us to share regarding where he serves. The mission diocese of Imphal in Northeast India is home to 34 tribes of Mongolian origin. The first Catholic baptism in the diocese was recorded in 1952. The Catholic population has now grown up to 101,283. The diocese has 45 parishes, and 8 Mission Centers. It currently has 174 priests including 114 indigenous tribal priests. The growth of the Church has always been accompanied by various challenges and persecutions during the past decades. Between 1990 – 2001, six of our young and dynamic missionaries were killed for witnessing the gospel.

Besides direct evangelization, the Church is actively involved in the everyday life of the people through other forms of apostolate like education, health care, self-help program, rehabilitation of the sick, drug addicts and the orphans. Much remains to be done for this interior and underdeveloped region through your participation and generous support.

In spite of the many challenges, missionary efforts are yielding an increase in vocation to priesthood and religious life. The proceeds of the 2022 Mission appeal will be used for providing food, safe drinking water facilities, primary education of tribal girls and health care for the rural tribal population in the newly established parish of St. John in Nungba. We look forward to your generous support for the implementation of this humanitarian project.



Safeguard the Children Did you know?



Teach your children what to do when they are lost. Preparing your children for a situation where they might get lost or separated from you can help resolve a scary situation more quickly.

Talk to your children about what to do if they ever get lost in a crowd. First, tell them to stay where they are. Teach them how to locate another safe adult — a park or store employee, someone in uniform, another mom with children — and how to ask for help.

A great tip for parents is to start immediately shouting a name, age, and description of the missing child so others around you are searching too.


