Brothers and sisters: He "for a little while" was made "lower than the angels," that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone.

For it was fitting that he, for whom and through whom all things exist, in bringing many children to glory, should make the leader to their salvation perfect through suffering. He who consecrates and those who are being consecrated all have one origin. Therefore, he is not ashamed to call them "brothers."

The Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, "Is it lawful for a husband to divorce his wife?" They were testing him. He said to them in reply, "What did Moses command you?" They replied, "Moses permitted a husband to write a bill of divorce and dismiss her." But Jesus told them, "Because of the hardness of your hearts he wrote you this commandment. But from the beginning of creation, God made them male and female. *For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.* So they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, no human being must separate." In the house the disciples again questioned Jesus about this. He said to them, "Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her; and if she divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery." And people were bringing children to him that he might touch them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this he became indignant and said to them, "Let the children come to me; do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it." Then he embraced them and blessed them, placing his hands on them.

"More happens through praying together with another person for one minute than through five years of name calling and arguing." I won't disagree with Bishop David's statement.

When we presume those we disagree with must be evil and are not worth praying for or praying with, we are making a harsh, self-righteous, judgement. Be humble. Be honest with yourself. I know that I have been wrong sometimes. Especially with other Christians we need to start by giving each other the benefit of the doubt regarding their intentions and not jump to condemnation and accusation. Have I listened to them to gain understanding? Perhaps they know something I am not yet aware of? Perhaps something of this world that I have chosen to believe which might be incomplete or false? And, yes, they might be wrong... yet, threatening them with harsh words and intimidating them with a loud voice might oppress and silence them... but will not convince nor change their heart. I do know when we respond with anger, it most likely is not of the Lord. Crushing those we disagree with might get my way, but not God's way who seeks

for us to love one another as He has loved us. Be gentle, patient and forgiving as the Lord has been with us. Do pray for them. Do try to find the faith and courage to pray with them. Don't doubt the power of prayer.

Speaking of prayer, one of the practices we are being asked to use during this Jubilee of the 250 year of the establishment of the Faith in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles (San Gabriel Mission) is to pray aloud once each week with at least one other person (outside of mass). I hope this is already happening with married couples... but the gospel of Matthew reminds us the power of two's and three's gathered together... and the presence of the Lord which is here when we unite hearts, minds and voices in prayer. (Get a pray buddy!)

Again, speaking of prayer, October is the month of the Holy Rosary. On Saturday, October 16th, following the 8am Mass this Rosary Crusade will be held outside where daily adoration is held.

Following the 8am and 10am masses today we do have coffee and donuts available. Our Saint Jerome Catholic School's 8th grade class is hosting this fellowship opportunity. Have a blessed week!
