



We try to have this every three years but for some reason this one ended up being postponed two years. I am grateful to the Jesuit community of LMU, as well as student and visiting priests who have offered to help provide priests for our daily masses this week. Each school year is a time for a fresh start. To help us as a parish begin the year renewed we will be having a special guest preaching at all the masses on Sunday, September 11th. This

messes we face today. Fr. Roy has Master's degrees in Chemistry, Theology and Philosophy with a Ph.D. from Boston College in the interdisciplinary areas of Chemistry, Neuroscience and Consciousness. He has been invited to speak on various topics in US, Canada, UK, Australia, and New Zealand including doing a TEDx talk. His presentations are interactive, and he strives to explain complex concepts from Neuroscience in easy-to-understand ways using multimedia, music, and the piano. I am looking forward to hearing Fr. Roy speak again. I believe you will find resources and strategies to help remain sane and saintly in the uncertainty we all face today.

PARISH MINISTRY SUNDAY will be bookending the feast of St. Jerome (9/30). We will be offering two Sundays, September 25th and Sunday, October 2nd, for parish groups to have the opportunity to educate and invite people who might be interested in learning more or joining with them in fellowship, worship and service. Coffee and donuts will be available following the 8am and 10am masses. If your group is interested in having a table in the hall for both or either of these Sundays (following morning masses) please contact Roxanne to reserve your place.

According to St. Jerome, "Ignorance of the scriptures is ignorance of Christ." Our next evening **Bible Study** will be welcoming those who want to know the Lord better. Fall sign-ups will begin in September. The focus will be on the Old Testament books of Tobit, Judith, Esther, and Maccabees.

Our St. Jerome School's **Run-4-Bucks** will be on Wednesday, September 28th. Your generous support helped us raise over twenty thousand dollars last year. This years monies will help us provide for our new religion books and other opportunities to help our children get the great Catholic education each child should have. Our school's children will be seeking our support on September 11th, 18th and 25th following Sunday services.

One of our public school teacher parishioners wrote me about being corrected and told not to say "bless you" when someone sneezes. She spoke about challenges of being a faithful Catholic in government schools. She trusts in God and remains hopeful. Do pray for all teachers who have to deal with this Freedom from Religion.

All are welcome to attend our services but Saint Jerome is not a place for people to come and do self-harm through drug use and other inappropriate behaviors which should not be seen in public. The drug-addicted and mentally ill do need our compassion and support in the path to wellness. I thank the police for what they can do, but realize that currently criminal behavior is not prosecuted until someone gets hurt. Sadly, we need better and more fencing around our property. I will speak more about this on another day. I am grateful to those offering to help repair our fencing where it has again been cut.

Let us continue to pray for the little ones, especially those who are being enabled in their addictions and those in need of psychological care.
