From the first book of Samuel (1 Sm 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23)

In those days, Saul went down to the desert of Ziph with three thousand picked men of Israel, to search for David in the desert of Ziph. So David and Abishai went among Saul's soldiers by night and found Saul lying asleep in the barricade, with his spear thrust into the ground at his head and Abner and his men sleeping around him. Abishai whispered to David: "God has delivered your enemy into your grasp this day. Let me nail him to the ground with one thrust of the spear; I will not need a second thrust!" Fr. Bill's Musings

Ash Wednesday will be on March 2nd. We will have mass at 8am and 7pm with ashes. We will also have a noon Ash Wednesday Service without mass.

The Knights of Columbus will be having their Friday Fish Fry Dinners during Lent. The first will be on March 5th. (Yes, no meat on Fridays of Lent.)

I was surprised and impressed by the number of people who joined us for the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, the World Day of Prayer for the Sick. Some were new faces and others, people I don't recall having seen since our response to covid closed churches.

When I returned from giving the Anointing of the Sick to those in the parking lot, I discovered that the line inside extended to the back of the church. I then assisted Fr. Uche in administering this wonderful sacrament.

At least one person asked, "How near death do I need to be to receive this sacrament?" A person does not have to be "in extremis" (in imminent danger of dying). If you have cancer and are preparing for chemo or radiation, please let this sacrament be a part of your preparation. If you are going to have surgery which requires general anesthesia, please let the Anointing of the Sick be one step in your pre-op. If you struggle with a chronic condition, please consider including the Anointing of the Sick quarterly as a part of your pain regimen. If you need a cane or walker to move safely about, please include quarterly Anointing's of the Sick to help you stay focused. If you are over seventy years of age, don't hesitate to get the Anointing of the Sick for any condition which might require hospitalization. Call the rectory and arrange an appointment with a priest.

- 4) **Reverend Augustus Tolton** is a former slave who in 1886 became the first Black priest in the U.S.A.
- 5) **Julia Greenly** is a former slave who became known as Denver's "Angel of Charity" for her work on behalf of that city's poor.
- 6) **Sister Henriette DeLille** is a Black nun born in 1813 from New Orleans who opened the first Catholic Senior Citizen's Home and also founded an order of women religious.



Today, as we deal with the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, it is noteworthy that the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC) reported that child safety has also been affected as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. "In 2021, NCMEC stated that they had experienced a 97.5% increase in online enticement reports between January 2020 and December 2020, versus the same time period in 2019." NCMEC maintains a 24-hour hotline at 1- 800-843-5678, and the Cyber Tipline receives reports of child sexual exploitation incidents via an online form at <https://report.cybertip.org/>.
