## From Fr. Bill

Red: the color of fire, the color of blood, the color chosen for celebrations of martyrs, the Lord's Passion and the Holy Spirit.

Last Sunday night fourteen of our teens were Confirmed. Although no cheeks were slapped our young people were on fire with the love of Christ and radiating the presence of the Holy Spirit.

I was seventeen years of age when my awareness of the Spirit of Jesus burning within me led me to apply for the pre-novate program of the Salesians of Don Bosco. (Boot camp for those considering Religious Life) At the time I was volunteering my summer at Camp Don Bosco in Arrowbear, California. I guess summers were longer then as we had eight weeks of camp with our 150 eight to fourteen year old kids.

I had been volunteering at Pace School for the Handicapped (across the street from Bosco) since my sophomore year in high school. Some of my classmates ditched school for surfing. I ditched school for service. (This is not an endorsement of ditching, but know that with all honors classes, I kept my A average.) I also volunteered at Rancho Los Amigos Hospital in Downey. At a time before video and computer games, I was hospitalized children and teens "Gameboy" for checkers, Old Maid, Go Fish, writing letters or just being someone who would listen.

Yes, I did sing at services at Bosco. I am grateful that some of the football players sang with us as that made it "acceptable" in our peer driven world. (Please note that at this time the only musical instruments I played were 8-tracks, records, cassettes and radio.)

I was popular before school when classmates needed algebra, geometry, chemistry or physics assistance with their homework... which involved their copying my "assistance" as I was in conversation with other friends.

My friends knew it before I did. I thought I was just being a good scout: friendly, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean and reverent. "Bill, have you ever thought of being a priest? I think you would make a good one." When different people made the same observation, I started to prayerfully consider it.

It was working at camp that convicted me. I was leading large groups in ways I didn't think I was capable of. I could not read in public at Bosco, but here I began reading bedtime stories to our

campers. I became aware of how my efforts, those two loaves and five fish I offered, seemed to help touch and change lives. I could feel the presence of the Spirit burning within me. I could see gifts and talents I didn't know I had helping transform me, those I worked with and those we served.

I was on Fire. It was intoxicating and engulfing. No wonder the crowds on Pentecost (a Jewish Feast) questioned at this spring harvest celebration and the feast of the new wine (both celebrated fifty days after Passover) if the apostles reckless zeal might be the consequence of a little too much sampling of this year's vintage? I knew the feeling. I had felt the power. I knew that Jesus had much more in store for me if I were willing to leave behind the nets of the secure and familiar... and followed Him on the path to priesthood... which at the time I didn't realize went through Calvary... but isn't this true for all disciples?

"If I am going to be a priest you'll need to touch my lips and help me in public speaking." Be careful what you pray for as when you ask and seek, you may receive. Most would not believe that my shyness in front of groups was a major area of growth I needed. He heard my prayer, but I had to do my part by accepting assignments which required me to speak.

If Jesus leads us to it, He gives us what we need to go through it. In His Spirit He gives us the power to transform our own lives and to help make His Kingdom more present and visible in this world.

Please do continue to pray for our newly baptized and confirmed. We are all anointed to go and make a difference in the world.

Speaking of making a difference, our Youth Minister, Lara Ratleff, will be married on June 5th to Jeremy Brosmer.



Please keep them and all young people seeking God's will in your prayers.

Jesus has a plan and purpose for each of us: our vocation. His Spirit guides and enables us for this mission.
