

## From Fr. Bill

This year has been incredibly challenging for our eucharistic ministers and ushers. As we have added ministers (as well as assembly) their areas of responsibility have needed to be modified to better serve our parish community. I am thankful for their patience and their focus on serving the Lord. I am grateful to their generosity as well as the humility needed in adjusting and adapting to varied situations. I am thankful that when miscommunications, misunderstandings or misinterpretations happen... that rather than reacting by judging another with wounded-ego and anger... a spirit of peace, joy, laughter and mutual-forgiveness is usually found.

I admit that I sometimes get overfocused on details about getting things to work exactly according to my plans and expectations. (My zoom computer seems to have a stress detector that creates obstacles and difficulties when I seem to forget that Jesus is in charge.) God laughs and reminds me that it is His plans for salvation, love and forgiveness which truly matter. This moment's little molehill isn't the Calvary I should be losing my temper, patience or soul over. Letty's laughter (sacristan and set-up specialist) reminds me to not let anxiety steal the grace of this moment. Peace be with you isn't just a greeting, but a place from which we are called to treat each other, as friends, especially when I may feel over-whelmed.

This Sunday at the 5pm mass we have 14 teens being Confirmed by Archbishop Jose Gomez. Please keep them in your prayers. I am grateful to the Knights of Columbus for stepping up to assist as vaccinated servers. I am grateful to the Confirmation Team as well as the parents and sponsors of our young people who have worked with us through the unique adventure of the second year of the Confirmation Program in the Age of Covid.

Just in case the bishop decides to ask a question (back in the day I was told any of the 213 Baltimore Catechism's Questions might be asked) I have decided to dust off some of the basics that are appropriate for this day.

Sacraments are outward signs instituted by Christ to give grace. (He breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit." – John 20:22)

The sacrament of Confirmation is the bestowal of that gift given to the Church at Pentecost in the souls of those upon whom the bishop imposes hands and anoints with the oil of Sacred

Chrism. At this final sacrament of initiation (baptism, confirmation, communion) the bishop prays for those being confirmed to receive the Holy Spirit, to be filled with Sanctifying Grace and the Seven Gifts which help us live as disciples of Jesus.

When we enter a new relationship we often gain a new name. For example, if you are married you become "my husband" or "my wife." And at Baptism we were given our Baptismal name (mine is Francis). At Confirmation as a sign of our new relationship with God and the community to be Jesus' disciples and bring the good news to others we pick a new name of someone who we hope to imitate (I chose Paul). So the bishop confirms us with this new name and formally acknowledges this new relationship as he says, "Peace be with you" and offers a sign of peace which these days seems to be a head-nod of acknowledgement or a hand-wave. (Please note that back in the day we got a gentle "slap" ... actually a tap... on the cheek as a reminder of the adversity disciples know comes with taking up our cross and following Jesus.) Loving relationships require sacrifice. I know the rewards are amazing... but when we chose to love, we chose to die to ourselves that others might gain life.

Good tools for discerning our growth in the Holy Spirit and Sanctifying Grace are the fruits of the Spirit: Gentleness, Self-control, Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Generosity, and Faithfulness. These are the fruits of a life lived in the Spirit of Jesus. Please note that their absence suggests we have not trusted God and learned to surrender to life in His Spirit. "My will be done" leads to different fruits than putting God and the needs of those He calls us to love before our selfish interests. Disciples strive to live in His Word, look for opportunities to serve (foot washing) and bring Jesus' merciful and loving presence to others.

God has made us to know Him, love Him and serve Him in this world, and to be happy with Him in the next. Living as the Confirmed is the path for us to fulfill the hopes God has for us to be holy and happy with Him in this world and the next.

Next Sunday is Pentecost. Red is a great color to wear as we celebrate the birthday of the church.



The events of 2020 pushed most of our lives more fully online than ever before: working from home virtual schooling, Zoom get-togethers. This past year also saw a dramatic increase in reports of online child abuse, including online enticements.

Enticement involves an individual communication online with someone believed to be a child, with the intent to commit a sex offense or to abduct the child. Online enticement can happen to any child using the internet. Parents should be aware of what their children do online, including who they talk to a what sites they visit.

## From the Acts of the Apostles

(Acts 1:1-11)

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for “the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.”

When they had gathered together they asked him, “Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?” He answered them, “It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, “Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven.”
