What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? ## Fr. Bill's Musings

I love you. Each day I pray for you. I really do wish you holiness and happiness. I apologize if these reflections offend or upset you. My goal is to help make you more aware and considerate. I understand how you might view this as "being political" or some crackpot theory as I agree that some have used covid for these purposes.

First, and I have absolute certainty on this: fat people are easy targets for being killed by covid. The covid data is clear that it kills the over-weight and obese at much higher rates than anyone else. I know that during our covid shut-down my weight has not just become a danger to my heart but is now putting me at risk to death by covid. You can wear a mask. You can get vaccine booster-shots. If I am not watching my weight and exercising, but remain obese... I am laying on a road hoping I don't get hit by a car. Our weight is something we can work on and with persistence and exercise, change. I need to use that fear, as well as my love for you, to motivate my need to lose weight.

Second, in the history of humanity, only one disease has been eliminated. That disease is smallpox. Other than that, each year ripples of diseases travel though the world. These are living organisms which adapt to survive and reproduce. Each year's waves of flu bugs are good examples of this.

Third, covid 19 was not a natural evolution of a virus, but one we apparently modified in a lab. It somehow got

out and as all living things do, has continued to reproduce, adapt and adjust in a variety of situations seeking to survive and multiply. Don't blame God on this one. We built it. We have opened pandora's box. We may deny there is a god but we love playing god. We may not have destroyed ourselves with a nuclear war... but we need to be humble in the face of God's creation. Just because we can do something does not mean we should do it.

Fourth, once covid 19 got into the general population, the chance to conquer it, ended. It has and will continue to evolve. God has made nature to find a way to live. Thankfully, covid has no intellect nor will. It isn't hunting us. As evidenced by its spread, it finds us fertile soil. Its goal is survival, not the elimination of all its possible hosts with its evolving ripples and waves... but this original sin is out and is like Adam and Eve cast into the world. We need to accept that and learn to live with it.

How am I learning to live with it? I've been vaccinated and I hope it helps. Losing weight and getting in better shape will help. Prayer and using good sense (e.g. wash/sanitize your hands) are always good resources.

Please note that there are more dangerous things than covid: cancer, heart disease, mental illness, depression, drug addiction, and increasing suicide rates especially among the young. I pray that God grant us the serenity to accept what we can not change. Give us the courage to change what we can. And that we gain the wisdom to know the difference.


