From the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 5:12-16)

From the book of Revelation (Rev 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19)

I, John, your brother, who share with you the distress, the kingdom, and the endurance we have in Jesus, found myself on the island called Patmos because I proclaimed God's word and gave testimony to Jesus. I was caught up in spirit on the Lord's day and heard behind me a voice as loud as a trumpet, which said, "Write on a scroll what you see." Then I turned to see whose voice it was that spoke to me, and when I turned, I saw seven gold lampstands and in the midst of the lampstands one like a son of man, wearing an ankle-length robe, with a gold sash around his chest. When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

The wedding reception was being held at La Mirada Country Club. It was around 2008. I remember being seated at a table with eight young adults. Years of waiting in Disneyland lines had taught me to start conversations with almost anyone. This day I met my match. The age of the iPhone had arrived. Physically together we were worlds apart. The arrival of bride and groom briefly distracted them and after quick pictures taken to mark the occasion, each quickly returned to their screen. I had never felt more isolated and alone.

This was my first awareness of the decline in socialization that has been forming our young people. By 2015 I was encountering young people who felt threatened by their mother or grandmothers ability to start conversations with acquaintances. Some spoke of being embarrassed and awkward by the friendliness and attention given by older relatives to a random person.

I was introduced to one of my grandnephews on Easter Sunday. I greeted him and he made some noise in response. I guess I shouldn't have expected more from a two year old whose eyes and fingers never left his iPhone screen for the hour his parents remained with us. Terrible two's? Only if you try to take his tech away.

I have appreciated Social Media during the COVID lockdowns. It helped me feel less isolated as I sat with my dog and cat. As time went on and COVID restrictions varied, I found myself feeling envious, jealous and irritated of those posting pictures of social gatherings. Seeing others together having a good time magnified my loneliness.

ness. After friends in Texas held a birthday party and I later heard that some of the parties had gotten COVID... I initially felt glad. "They deserved it." Then the words of St. Paul (Romans 12:15) slapped me down. "Rejoice with those who rejoice. Weep with those who weep." They may have been imprudent but I was being evil.

Studies have shown that the more time people spend on social media, the more loneliness they actually experience. Our children and teens' sense of self-worth and hope are diminished in a virtual world of influencers, exaggerations, photo filters, and vicious, often anonymous, bullying. And they often consider these strangers their friends.

Speaking of media, there could be 60 billion acts of kindness and mercy today. But none of them will be repeatedly drilled into our consciousness as the acts of violence and hatred will be. "If it bleeds, it leads." The frequency of these acts of hatred are magnified and distorted by repeated views. My life experience has taught me that most people are actually kind and good, but our children are being shown a never ending carnival of hatred, negativity and violence. Allowing them to repeatedly view this stuff, I believe, is child abuse. No wonder self-harm and depression are at record high levels for our children.

Please pray for our children. Help them to not just watch life, but spend time with them to actually live life. Please consider locking up all your tech (a time out) and doing things together.




