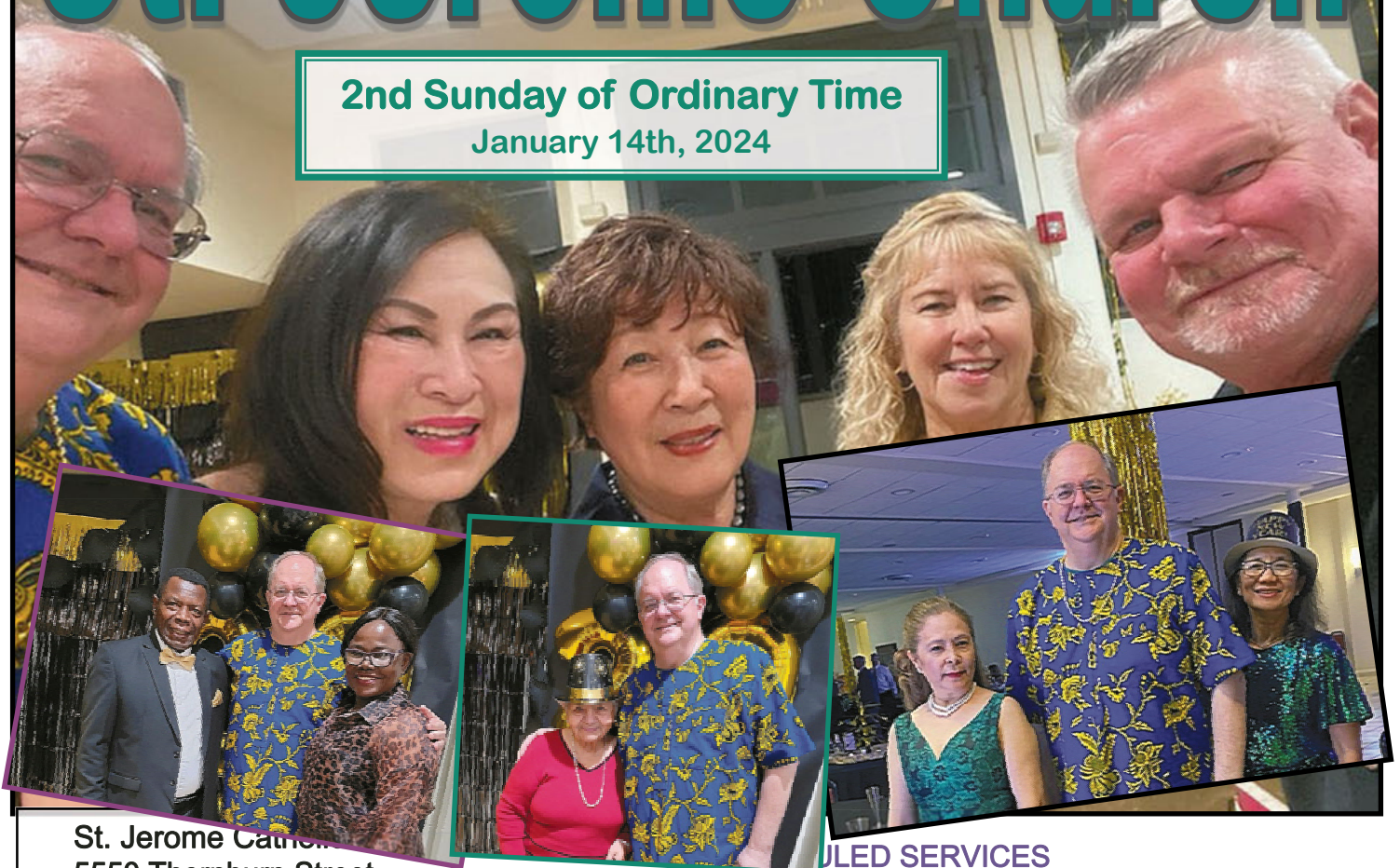

Liturgy of the Word

1/14/2024

From the first book of Samuel (1 Sm 3:3b-10, 19)
Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD where the ark of God was. The LORD called to Samuel, who answered, "Here I am." Samuel ran to Eli and said, "Here I am. You called me." "I did not call you," Eli said. "Go back to sleep." So he went back to sleep. Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli. "Here I am," he said. "You called me." But Eli answered, "I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep."

At that time Samuel was not familiar with the LORD, because the LORD had not revealed anything to him as yet. The LORD called Samuel again, for the third time. Getting up and going to Eli, he said, "Here I am. You called me." Then Eli understood that the LORD was calling the youth. So he said to Samuel, "Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening." When Samuel went to sleep in his place, the LORD came and revealed his presence, calling out as before, "Samuel, Samuel!" Samuel answered, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

Samuel grew up, and the LORD was with him, not permitting any word of his to be without effect.

From the Gospel according to John (Jn 1:35-42)
John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" — which translated means Teacher —, "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" — which is translated Christ —. Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" — which is translated Peter.

Fr. Bill's Musings

I had a blast at our close of the year party. Thank you for all those who made for a great evening. I am already looking forward to this year's event.

Ordinary time? I have enough life experience to know what is considered "ordinary" is constantly changing. I remember elevator operators, rotary phones, television stations signing off, prayer in public schools, first graders walking to school, cigarette dispensers in hospitals, and computers the size of our church hall that my cellphone has more computing power than.

The thing that is most ordinary is change. This change is often called progress... but Christians know that we must not judge by appearance, but by it's fruits. Not all change is a blessing and good, nor is all change necessarily bad even though unfamiliar or causing discomfort. We are called to not evaluate by intention but by consequences and outcomes. Just because it is new or different does not mean that it is actually better.

We live in interesting times. Outward forces are what they are. I have the power and choice of how I choose to react, respond and adapt to these signs of the times. As the baptized, I am an agent of God's mercy, forgiveness and love.

Ordinary Time actually comes from counting the days and weeks of our life. (Ordinal numbers:

1st, 2nd, etc.) Think of a bride preparing for her June Wedding. The days are moving quickly. Once finished, you can't get them back. These days and weeks are being used in preparation. Things need to be worked on. Contacts need to be made. Choices are made that for good or poor will need to be embraced and made the best of. So many people that she needs to work with... keeping her eyes on the prize in spite of adversity. Tears will be shed, but with commitment, hard-work and God's grace... all things are possible.

As Catholics we know that each day is an opportunity to make a difference. "God's will be done" is what we are called to be working upon. We realize that avoiding sin is an essential part of this, yet we also know that this is not enough. For Catholics, each day we should practicing the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy... and these are our marching orders for helping God's will to be done.

What I appreciate about the works of mercy is that even in a hospital bed I can be comforting, counseling, bearing patiently, forgiving and praying. Even fear cannot prevent us from living our faith as practicing Catholics. Disciple's of Christ don't make excuses, they use the days they are given to make a difference in helping God's kingdom to come and will to be done.
