I got to know Fr. Paul Wolkovits when I encountered him at Sacred Heart Church where he had once served. Paul was "New York" and quirky. As I had studied philosophy in Jersey and have been described as quirky, we got along well. A few meals, very dry humor, good conversation and an occasional glass of wine he had found, made for good times. I haven't seen him since covid. Retired, he occasionally visited Los Angeles. As he was a pastor here at St. Jerome, in your kindness keep him in your prayers.

I won't claim that when I am contacted by old friends, it is never good news... I automatically find myself preparing for someone or something which needs prayer. If I'm being asked to witness their wedding, baptize their child or attend some celebration I am grateful to share in their good news. However, the longer I am a priest, the more often it is about their having lost someone they love.

"Father, this is Norma. Maybe you've heard about Laura?"

By the tone of Norma's voice I know she is hurting. I've known Norma, her sister, Laura, and their parents for over twenty years. I have worked with them on at least 30 young adult retreats (Search for Christian Maturity). They have called me for celebrations and Anointing's of the Sick since my departure from the retreat center in 2010. I have seen them a couple of times since covid at funerals.

"She was hit by a car and killed after walking our grandma into her senior care facility. The driver said he didn't see her. They said death was almost instant." (I am numb and crying even as I type.)

Laura was a Catholic School secretary who was like a second mom to many of the school's children. She was not tall and was built like a bowling ball. Don't get in her way. She was hard working, caring and committed. I know she loved the Lord. I know the Lord loves Laura. I pray she and we are ready.

I guess I'll be seeing many of the young adults I was blessed to work with from 1998 to 2010. I just wish that people I consider kids didn't die before me. I wanted to be there to welcome THEM home.

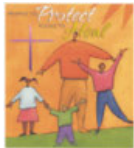
