From the book of Genesis (Gn 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18)  
God put Abraham to the test. He called to him, "Abraham!" "Here I am!" he replied. Then God said: "Take your son Isaac, your only one, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him up as a holocaust on a height that I will point out to you."

When they came to the place of which God had told him, Abraham built an altar there and arranged the wood on it. Then he reached out and took the knife to slaughter his son. But the LORD's messenger called to him from heaven, "Abraham, Abraham!" "Here I am!" he answered. "Do not lay your hand on the boy," said the messenger. "Do not do the least thing to him. I know now how devoted you are to God, since you did not withhold from me your own beloved son." As Abraham looked about, he spied a ram caught by its horns in the thicket. So he went and took the ram and offered it up as a holocaust in place of his son.

Again the LORD's messenger called to Abraham from heaven and said: "I swear by myself, declares the LORD, that because you acted as you did in not withholding from me your beloved son, I will bless you abundantly and make your descendants as countless as the stars of the sky and the sands of the seashore; your descendants shall take possession of the gates of their enemies, and in your descendants all the nations of the earth shall find blessing— all this because you obeyed my command."

Brothers and sisters: If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but handed him over for us all, how will he not also give

us everything else along with him? Who will bring a charge against God's chosen ones? It is God who acquits us, who will condemn? Christ Jesus it is who died—or, rather, was raised—who also is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us.

Gospel Verse: From the shining cloud the Father's voice is heard: This is my beloved Son, listen to him.

From the Gospel according to Mark (Mk 9:2-10)  
Jesus took Peter, James, and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no fuller on earth could bleach them. Then Elijah appeared to them along with Moses, and they were conversing with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here! Let us make three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He hardly knew what to say, they were so terrified. Then a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; from the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone but Jesus alone with them.

As they were coming down from the mountain, he charged them not to relate what they had seen to anyone, except when the Son of Man had risen from the dead. So they kept the matter to themselves, questioning what rising from the dead meant.

### NICENE CREED

### PRAYER TO OVERCOME RACISM (At end of Intercessions)

We ask for your help in calling on your Son, seeking forgiveness for the times when we have failed to love and respect one another.

We ask for your help in obtaining from your Son the grace we need to overcome the evil of racism and to build a just society.

We ask for your help in following your Son, so that prejudice and animosity will no longer infect our minds or hearts but will be replaced with a love that respects the dignity of each person.

Mother of the Church, the Spirit of your Son Jesus warms our hearts: pray for us. Amen.

### FAST AND ABSTINENCE

As Friday was the day of Jesus' suffering and death, the Church asks Catholics to **ABSTAIN FROM EATING MEAT ON ALL THE FRIDAYS OF LENT**. ABSTINANCE forbids the eating of meat for those who are of age of 14 years and older.

### Fr. Bill's Musings

As Jesus goes off into the mountain to pray it might be good to recall the three essential things the Church is created to do: Pray, Serve and Evangelize. As Church we gather together to worship as we obey Jesus' command, "Do this in memory of me." We are called to serve one another especially the poor. "If I, therefore, the master and teacher, have washed your feet, you ought to wash one another's feet." And we are called to share the good news of God's love and Jesus' sacrifice which makes the gift of salvation possible. In living this we save our soul and help others learn the meaning and purpose of their life. Prayer, service and sharing the good news done daily help us truly stay connected in Christ's body: the Church.

Reminder that our regional bishop, Bishop Matthew Elshoff, is asking us to do a Common Penance for Lent: pray an extra Hail Mary each day for vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life.

Perhaps it is my age showing, but Pope Francis' statement in his Lenten Message for 2024 that "The Church's synodal form, which in these years we are rediscovering and cultivating..." has me confused. In my ignorance I am unaware of the existence of a synodal form of church that previously existed unless this is a veiled reference to the Council of Jerusalem found in the Acts of the Apostles? I do know that some religious orders have experimented with something like this... but how can we "rediscover" something that does not seem to have been? Perhaps I slept through that lesson of Church history? Regardless let us pray for the pope and our bishops. And I will keep praying and studying.

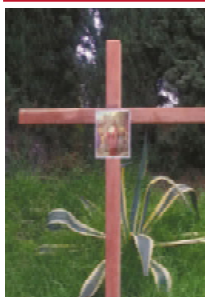

Mother Lange

Venerable Mother Mary Lange, 1790?-1882, (i.e. Elizabeth Clarisse Lange) is a great Catholic woman who is on the path to canonization. She needs one more miracle for beatification and another to be canonized as a saint.

The exact date of Elizabeth's birth is unclear. Her family were people of means and had a business in Haiti. Unrest and a slave revolt erupted in the late 1780's. The upper-class were being hunted and killed. Elizabeth was born into this mess with the family on the move around 1790. They made it safely to Santiago de Cuba where she was raised. Elizabeth grew up in the French-speaking area of the city and was well educated.

Elizabeth and some of her family left Cuba to seek peace and security in the United States. They eventually settled in Baltimore, Maryland, where many French-speaking Catholic refugees from Haiti had settled. Elizabeth quickly recognized that the children of the many Caribbean immigrants needed education. A loving, courageous and deeply spiritual woman, Elizabeth was not only an independent thinker but was a woman of action.

Elizabeth and her friend Marie Madeleine Balas began offering free education to children of the migrants. They opened their home in the Fells Point area of Baltimore City and began teaching. Please note that at that time, Maryland was a slave state and public schools would not be available for children of color until 1866. Elizabeth used her own money for supplies and charged nothing for her services.

The Archbishop of Baltimore, James Whitfield, came to know of her work and recognized the importance of Catholics being educated. Around 1828 he asked Father James Joubert to investigate if Elizabeth might be willing to start a school for "girls of color." Elizabeth revealed to Fr. Joubert that she had been waiting for God's call for more than 10 years. She asked if she could start a religious order. Fr. Joubert became convinced that this was a good idea. He pledged to provide guidance, solicit funds and encourage other "women of color" to consider joining the congregation. Elizabeth was overjoyed.

Father Joubert returned to the Archbishop. He helped convince him that Elizabeth was the person and that this was the time to stand against the culture of the region. (People of color there had been prohibited from joining religious communities and wearing the habit.) The Archbishop supported Elizabeth's dream and allowed Elizabeth and three other women to take vows of poverty, chastity and obedience. Elizabeth became the superior of the Oblate Sisters of Providence and took the name: Mother Mary Lange.

Mother Mary worked tirelessly helping and teaching those who so desperately needed her and her followers. She assisted night and day during two separate cholera epidemics, one in the early 1830s and another in the 1840s. She did whatever the poor needed. "To her Black brothers and sisters, she gave of herself and her material possessions until she was empty of all but Jesus, whom she shared generously with all by being a living witness to his teaching."

Being a black woman and a nun, Mother Mary had to fight off hatred, poverty and racial injustice. She never tired of fighting for those in need and lived to see the 50th anniversary of her order. Mother Mary Lange, feeble and almost blind, was relieved of her duties in 1876. She lived another 16 years and passed away on February 3, 1882. She died around 92 years of age.

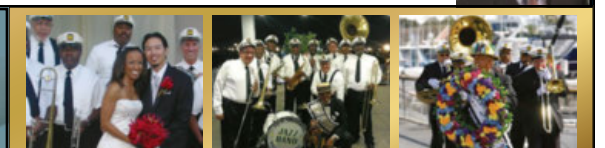
